Within the Montana University System (MUS) Core, all students must complete at least one class that includes significant content related to the cultural heritage of American Indians. To ensure quality learning outcomes and content, the faculty at Helena College developed criteria for designating courses as having significant content.

- Analyze and/or apply the contributions of American Indian scholarship within its given discipline.
- Utilize Indigenous knowledge, perspectives, and worldviews in course planning.
- Contrast and compare the unique characteristics of North American Indian tribes, bands, Pueblos, groups, and language families.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the historical, current, and/or continuing evolution of Native American cultures, histories, and sovereignty.
- Analyze the events, issues, and consequences of the American Indian genocide.
- Apply a comprehensive and practical understanding of U.S. Indian law and policy, colonization/decolonization, and nation-building.
- Examine North American Indian mythology, spiritual beliefs, and/or aesthetic traditions.

To date, six courses have been reviewed and updated to ensure content is meeting the criteria.

On Friday, March 17, and Saturday, March 18, 2023, Helena College hosted the **16<sup>th</sup> Annual Indian Education** for All Best Practices Conference sponsored by the Montana Office of Public Instruction (OPI). This year's theme was "*Strengthening and Healing through Cultural Knowledge and Education*." The conference honored the cultural heritage of all tribal nations in every Montana classroom. Over 220 participants attended the event.

**Sarah Dellwo, Executive Director of Enrollment** attended a leadership training offered by **Leadership Helena** on March 9, 2023, presented by Shawn Backbone of the Helena Indian Alliance. The training focused on understanding the American Indian experience in relation to government policies and the ability of reservations to develop resources. It covered a wide range of topics including the origins of the Crow tribe, land and banking policies that limit resource development, and blood quantum and the effect that is having on tribal enrollment.
