

GOVERNOR'S BEST AND BRIGHTEST SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



Three types of scholarship awards to help Montana students realize their dreams



The Governor's Best and Brightest Scholarship Program provides Montana residents with greater access to Montana's postsecondary institutions and tribal colleges, through scholarship grants based on academic achievement and financial need. The goal of these scholarships is to relieve student debt burdens, allowing more Montanans to stay in the state upon graduation.

The Governor's Best and Brightest Scholarship Program is divided into 3 scholarships, each scholarship is administered in a different way.

MERIT and MERIT-AT-LARGE

Merit and Merit-at-Large scholarships are awarded to students who plan to attend either a 2 or 4 year institution. A student attending a 4 year campus will receive \$1,000/semester (\$2,000/year) for 8 semesters. Students who attend a 2 year campus will receive \$1,000/semester (\$2,000/year) for 4 semesters.

High School MERIT Scholarships

Each Montana High School may award one Merit Scholarship. To receive a scholarship a student must demonstrate academic excellence, by having either a 3.0 GPA, or scoring at least 20 on the ACT or 1440 on the SAT.

To apply:

Applying is a multi-step process, students must complete each of the following steps by the deadline for their application to be considered. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted:

1. Take the ACT or SAT test by December of their senior year
2. Apply to and be accepted by one of the eligible campuses
3. Register at www.scholarship.mt.gov
4. Print and mail the signed application, along with a copy of the college acceptance letter, high school transcript (reflecting 7th semester cumulative GPA), and proof of ACT/SAT score (taken by December) to the office of SFS **postmarked by March 15th**

Merit AT-LARGE Scholarships

Graduating high school students, students already attending college, non-traditional and home schooled students are encouraged to apply. A committee will evaluate and score the applicant essays and activity lists to determine recipients.

To apply:

Applying is a multi-step process, students must complete each of the following steps by the deadline for their application to be considered. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted:

1. Apply to and be accepted by one of the eligible campuses
2. Register at www.scholarship.mt.gov
3. Print and mail the signed application, along with a copy of the college acceptance letter, most recent school transcript, and/or proof of ACT/SAT score (taken by December) to the office of SFS **postmarked by March 15th**

NEED-BASED

Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded annually for a maximum of two consecutive years.

2-year institutions will be allocated need-based awards each year based upon their level of enrollment. The financial aid office will be responsible for identifying and awarding scholarships to need-based recipients using information obtained from the FAFSA.

Eligibility Requirements

A student is eligible to receive a scholarship providing the student:

- Is a resident of the State of Montana
- Has been accepted by an eligible Montana post-secondary institution
- For scholarships based upon merit, has obtained a high school GPA of at least 3.0 or a score of at least 20 on the ACT or 1440 on the SAT college admission test
- For scholarships based on financial need, has completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), and does not have an expected family contribution (EFC) exceeding the cost of attendance
- Does not utilize a Montana University System Honor Scholarship for the same period of enrollment
- If a male, has met the Title IV selective service requirements
- Is not in default on a Title IV or state of Montana education loan
- Does not owe a refund to a federal Title IV or state of Montana student financial aid program
- Is not incarcerated
- Is seeking a first certificate, associate, or baccalaureate degree
- Begins using the next chronological semester (excluding summer)

Renewing Governor's Scholarships

Students must:

- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress
- MERIT & Merit AT-LARGE - complete 24 credits per academic year
