Over the last eight years, Distance Education at MSU-Great Falls has experienced rapid growth and expansion in the numbers of enrollments served and numbers/types of courses offered. Within the MUS, MSU-Great Falls arguably boasts the third largest number of online enrollments behind MSU-Billings and The University of Montana. The number of adjunct and full-time faculty as well as the number of integrated online credit-bearing courses will continue to stretch and challenge the institution without new resources. MSU- Great Falls has been able to stay on the cutting edge (credit hours in distance education, course and program offerings, etc.) with several other campuses in the state of Montana with only 2.0 FTE in direct staffing (Student Support Coordinator and an Instructional Designer). Yet it is the only campus in the MUS without a student fee to support or defray the costs associated with online and distributed learning. In order to sustain current operations and continue growth and innovation in future, the College needs to implement an online and distributed learning fee to continue to meet and prepare for the future growth of online offerings at the institution.

# Student Pass-Through Exam Fees

Many of our healthcare programs require students/graduates to sit for and pass national board examinations to earn their license necessary to become employed. We have found that including the expenses of preparing for and taking the exams into the program reduce the overall costs (through group discounts, etc.), allows the use of financial aid to cover the expenses, and often encourage greater, more-timely participation, as well as increased success as a result of group preparation.

The EMS program has recently gone through the national accreditation process with COAEMSP (Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for the Emergency Medical Services Professions). The writing of the self-study and site-visit pointed to many procedures and competencies that needed to be added to the program in order to qualify for accreditation. The curriculum has been revamped as recommended by COAEMSP, and will result in increased consummable supplies required in each EMT/EMS course. As well, sterile procedures in health programs on campus have been evaluated and during the evaluation, it was determined that supplies were being reused multiple times in laboratory and field settings. To better prepare our students for the workforce and to mirror requirements in hospitals, clinics, and other healthcare facilities, these procedures have been updated requiring immediate disposal of supplies used after each patient procedure. These updated sterile procedures will result in increased quantities of consummable supplies required for each course. To determine the supplies which will be now required for each course, all health programs on campus have been required to analyze all supplies used by each student and determine the total cost of the supplies per semester per student.

Many of our programs utilize the expertise of community members involved in various fields and based on the advice of our Advisory Board in the computer technology field, this is a new course added to the curriculum as recommended by that Board. With the technology field constantly evolving and with common course numbering, two courses were dropped from the curriculum, and three courses were added to better prepare our students for the workforce.
