Rationale or justification for the decision based on the program review process established at the campus. Include graduation numbers and student majors for each of the last seven (7) years for every program under review.

- Strong growing program that has doubled the number of majors since its inception in 2007.
- An average of 93 majors and 12 graduates over the last five years.
- Is governed by an active Advisory Board of professionals in law enforcement who make recommendations about curriculum and program offerings to the Criminal Justice faculty.
- Central program providing service course work to the Sociology major offering sociology students a number of courses that count as restricted electives under the Crime and Criminal Justice area of specialization.
- Provides a concrete route to employment opportunities for students, with careers ranging from law enforcement, to corrections, to the legal system, to social service organizations.
- Faculty are deeply committed and connected to several community advisory boards.
- Graduates of the program help to meet the needs of criminal justice and other agencies in south central Montana and across the state. High placement of graduates (77% in 2011).
- The internship program allows students to obtain practical work experience with a criminal justice agency and provides part time employees to those agencies.
