## 2016 All Academic Team

The purpose of Phi Theta Kappa is to recognize and encourage scholarship among associate degree students. To achieve this purpose, the organization provides opportunities for the development of leadership and service.

Phi Theta Kappa, two-year and community college presidents and community college state associations sponsor All-State Community College Academic Team ceremonies in 38 participating states.

The following students were nominated by their respective two-year college faculty and staff and represent some of the best and brightest students in our state's two-year and community colleges. Upon nomination, each of these students was automatically named to the All-State Community College Academic Teams.

The student receiving the highest <u>All-USA Community College Academic Team</u> application score in each state is named a Coca-Cola New Century Scholar and represents his/her state in the opening ceremonies at the American Association of Community Colleges Convention. In addition, one student from a Phi Theta Kappa chapter in Canada and one student from a Phi Theta Kappa chapter in the other seven sovereign nations where Phi Theta Kappa chapters exist are named Coca-Cola New Century Scholars. Each Coca-Cola New Century Scholar will receive a \$2,000 scholarship, and each institution will receive special recognition at the American Association of Community Colleges Convention.

The Coca-Cola New Century Scholars program is sponsored annually by the American Association of Community Colleges, The Coca-Cola Foundation, the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation, and Phi Theta Kappa.
