REPORT:

- Dawson Community College was awarded the 2017 Employer of Choice by the Glendive Job Service Employer Committee. A small reception was held, to present the plaque and make the announcement at DCC on April 11, 2017.
- Suela Cela, Enrollment Director for DCC, along with the state coordinator of dual enrollment, presented a talk, "Dual Enrollment 101" at the Western Regional Dual Enrollment Conference in Missoula, April 3-5. They were the only Montanans to address the conference.
- Special letters of invitation have been sent to local and state leaders for our graduation ceremony on May 11. This year we will host a special luncheon, for invited guests, prior to graduation. I look forward to honoring all of our graduates and the great achievements



they have made at Dawson Community College. We thank all those who have sent of letters of thanks and who will be coming to graduation.

- Dawson Community College is excited to once again host the GEAR Up Summer Camp on our campus this June. Thanks to Marilyn Dutton and her efforts to secure the grant and coordinate this program.
- Makoshika State Park is placing an Information Kiosk on DCC property. Placed in the gravel parking lot south of the Toepke Center, it will identify the property boundaries as well as several of the incredible hiking trails within the park system. A small move toward a closer alignment with our Makoshika neighbors.
- We continue to work with MSU Agriculture Education on an articulation agreement. The
 proposed plan is for them to accept our Agriculture Business Livestock Management
 degree and we will create an educational certificate for those who choose to transfer into
 Agriculture Education at MSU. I want to thank Bob Mokwa for putting us in contact with
 Tracy Dougher.
- We have outlined our academic unit plan for OCHE. This plan will be sent to all faculty for feedback. Feedback will be provided to the President by May 1.
- Residence Life is looking toward future growth and will add Residence Assistants to its team this fall. The selection process is underway and our goal is to include Learning Objectives to this component of the DCC Learning Environment as we move forward. Nothing is yet set in stone as we will process this concept and others after the team is mostly in place. Next fall, Learning Objectives may look something like this...

- Traci Masau attended the NWCCU Annual Conference in March. This conference provides colleges with valuable information, updates and procedures for writing reports. Next year I plan to take the writing team to the conference to network and ensure that we have all the pieces in place for reaffirmation of accreditation. DCC will send at least one person annually to this conference.
- Dawson Community College will have the first ever Ranch Rodeo Team competing under the NILE umbrella. We are the first college in Montana, and possibly in the nation, to have this type of competitive team. We plan to have two teams of five students each. Montana cowboy and cowgirl country is the best place to begin this great adventure!!
