The Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities gave UM high marks during the culmination of its latest seven-year review by renewing the University's <u>accreditation with no recommendations</u>.

UM celebrated the grand opening of its <u>new Missoula College Building</u>.

UM College of Education and Human Sciences received a <u>\$10 million gift</u> from the Washington Foundation

<u>The Montana Native Botanic Garden</u> celebrated 50 year anniversary in August.

Donors stepped up to support UM in a big way this year, topping <u>\$50 million</u> for the fourth year in a row.

UM was named to the <u>Princeton Review's</u> 2018 list of top four-year colleges and universities in North America.

UM passed a rigorous scientific review to become an official university partner of the U.S. Department of the Interior's <u>Northwest Climate Science Center</u>.

UM Dining furthered its <u>commitment to supporting local food and business services</u> by incorporating more local products into its Bear Hugs care packages.
