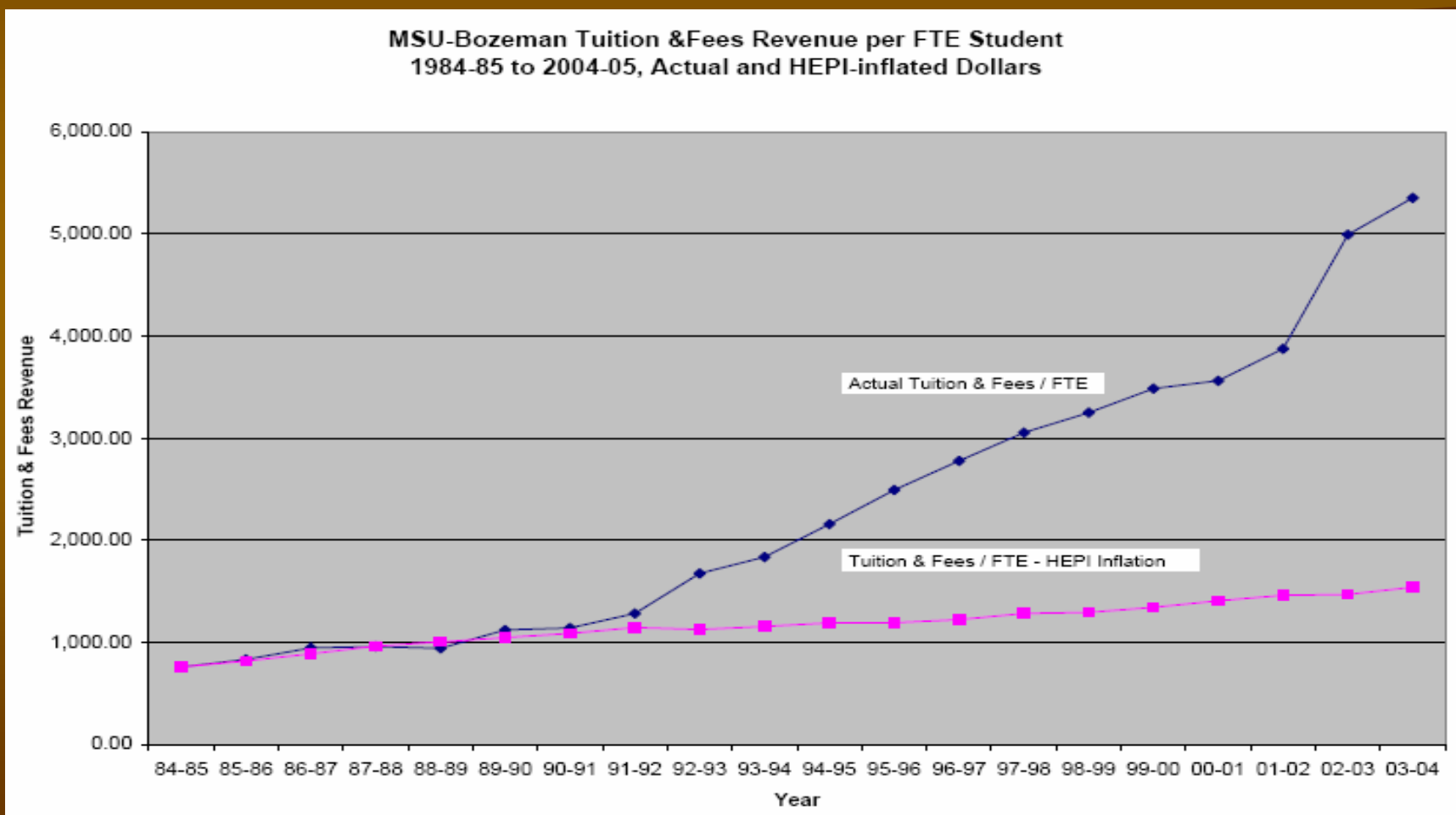


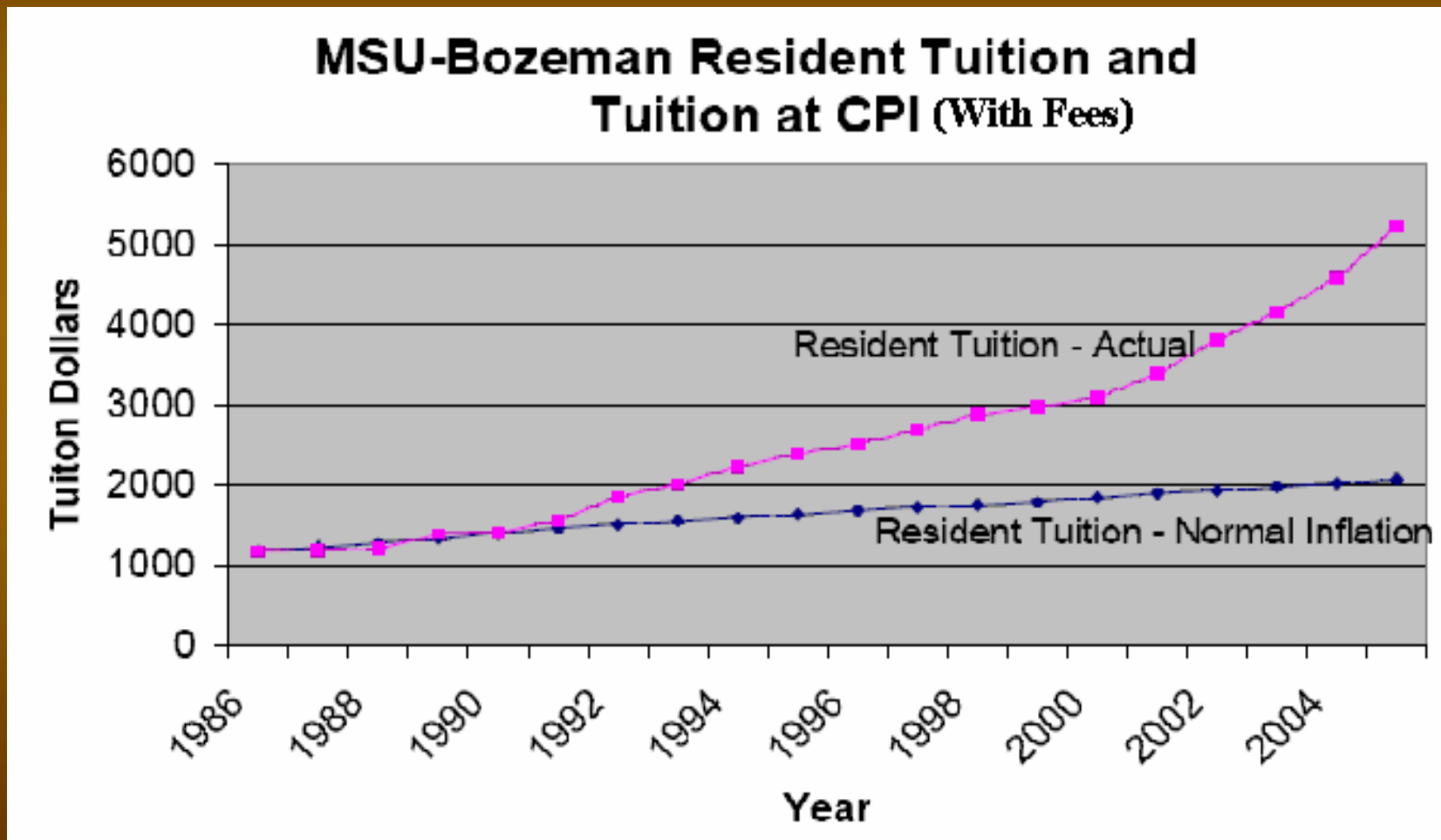

TUITION & FEES/FTE VS. HEPI




RESIDENT TUITION & FEES



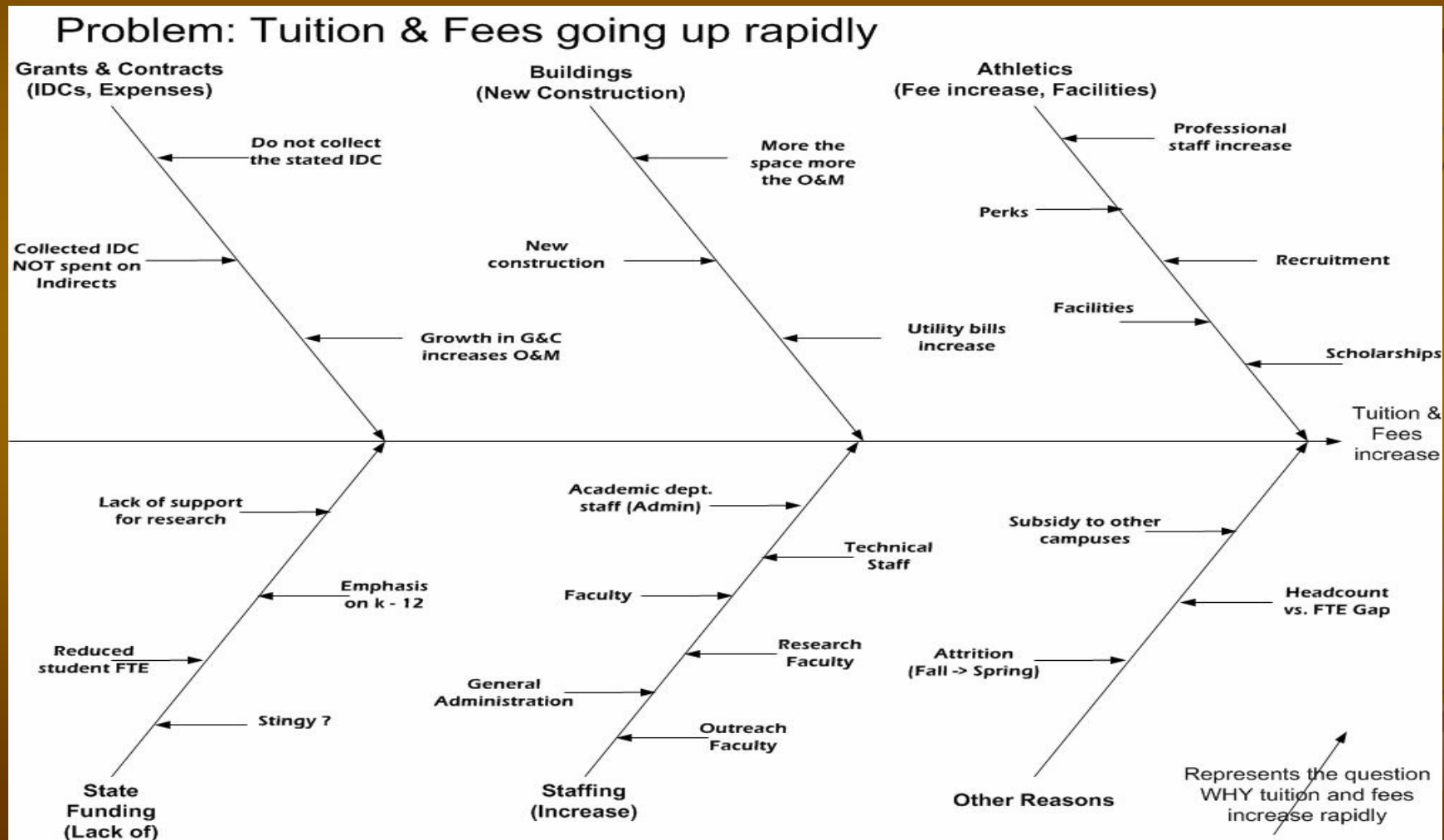
SUMMARY

- Tuition: approx. 4 times HEPI tuition
- Hard for students to afford
- The total number of sections offered remained the same at 1570 from FY 02-04
- Tuition is going up by \$400+ in next year

PRICE VS. COST

- In economy: $\text{Price} = \text{Cost} + \text{Profit}$
 - In Higher Ed: $\text{Price} = \text{Cost} - \text{Subsidy}$
 - Net price of Higher Ed: (William E Troutt)
 - Total price of attendance – Students' pay after financial aid
 - Calculating net price is hard, with almost 3 out of 4 students receiving some financial aid

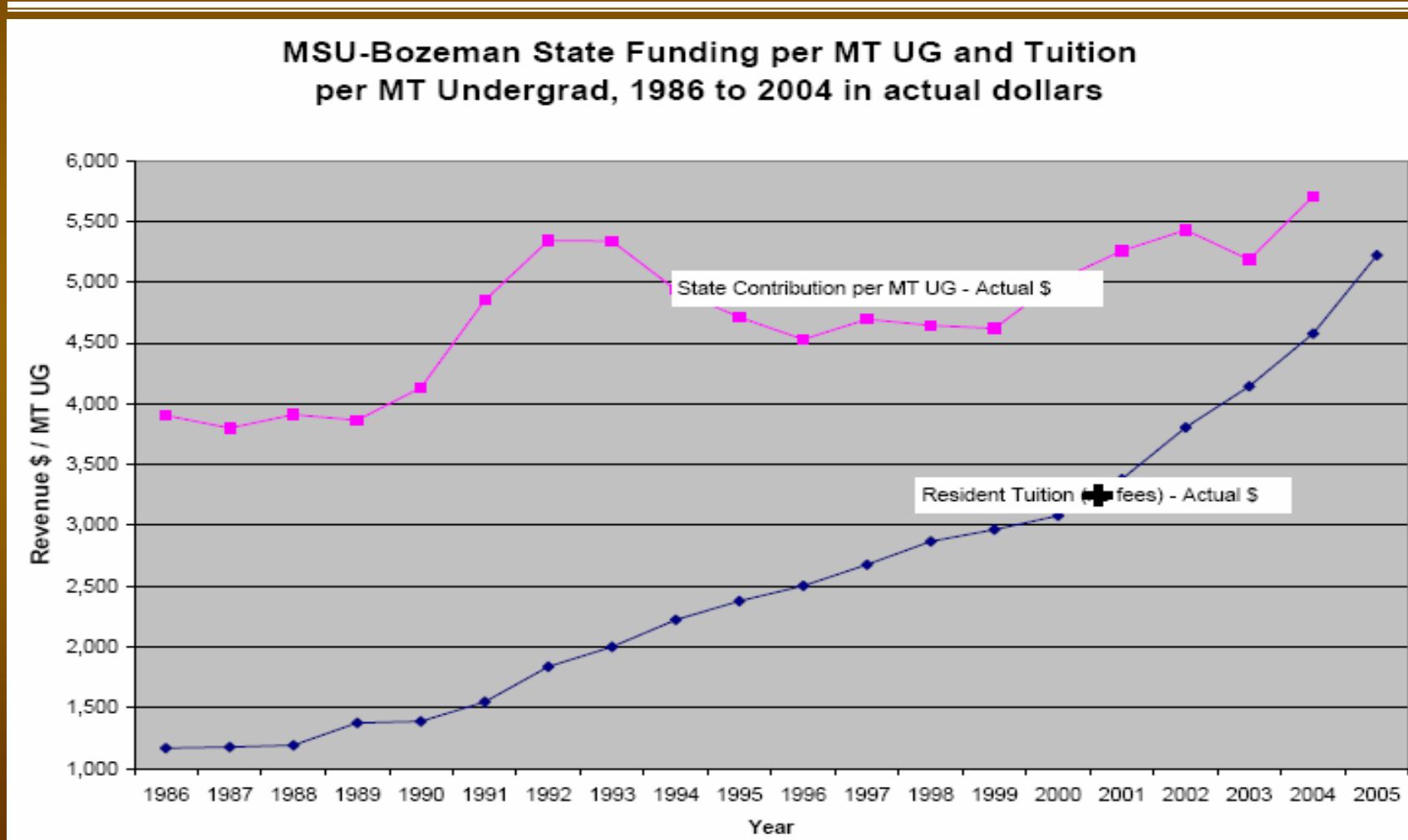



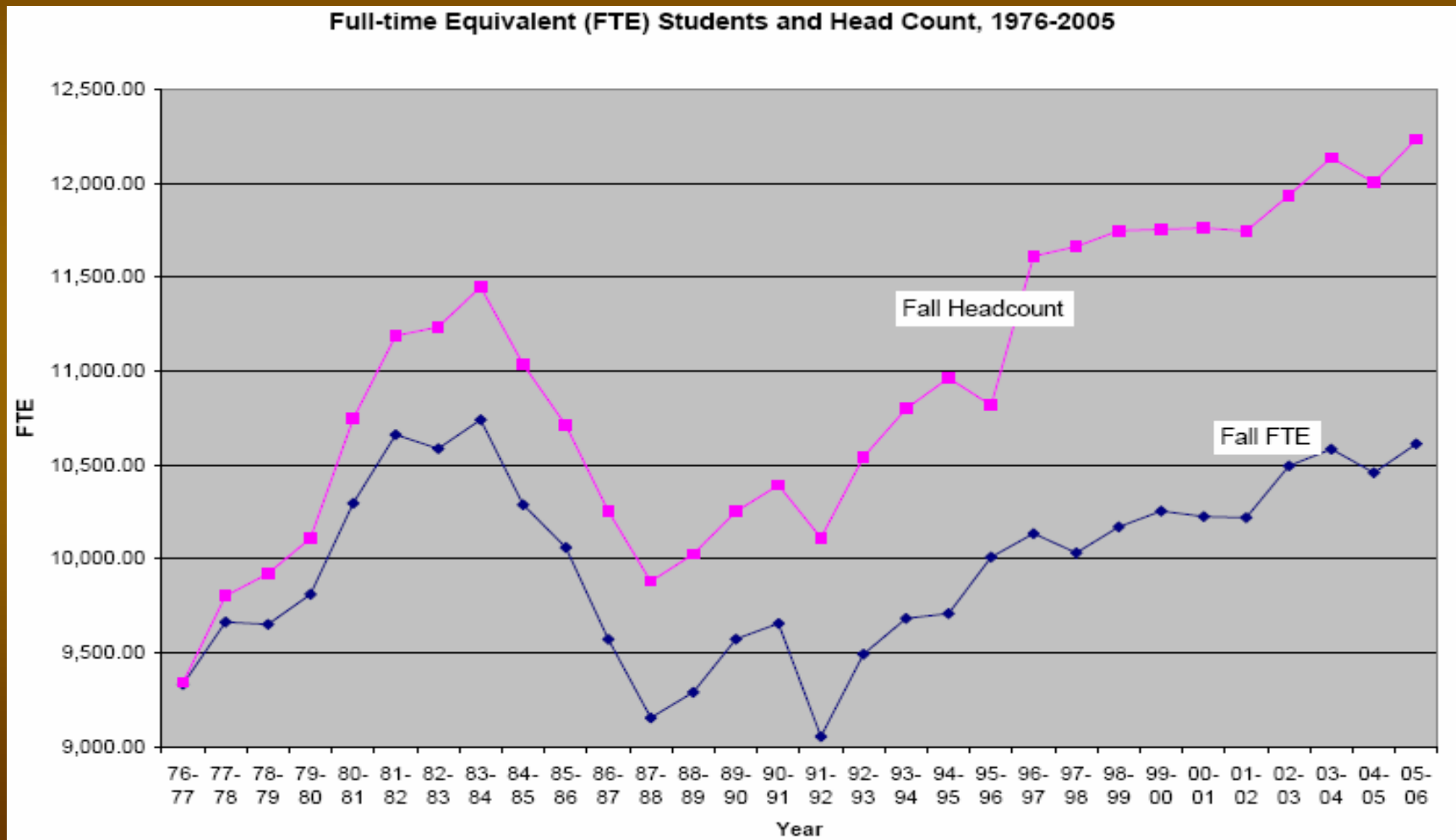
STATE \$ VS. RESIDENT T&F (Actual \$)



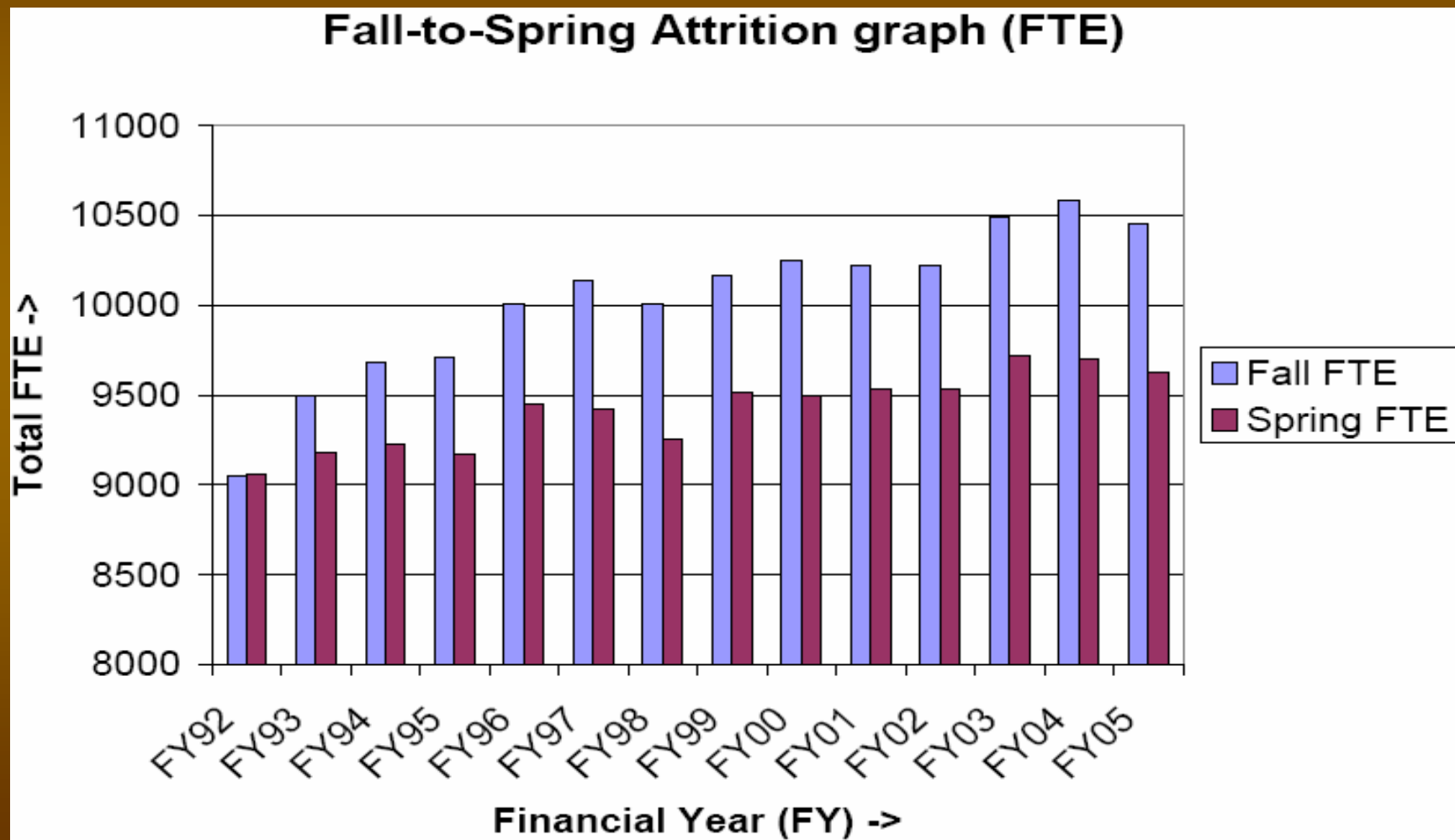
STATE FUNDING

- State funding formula is based on Resident FTE
 - Old funding criteria did not account for Non-resident to Resident conversion
 - Fall-to-Spring attrition affects FTE
 - Currently @ 7.97% (FY 05)

FALL-TO-SPRING ATTRITION

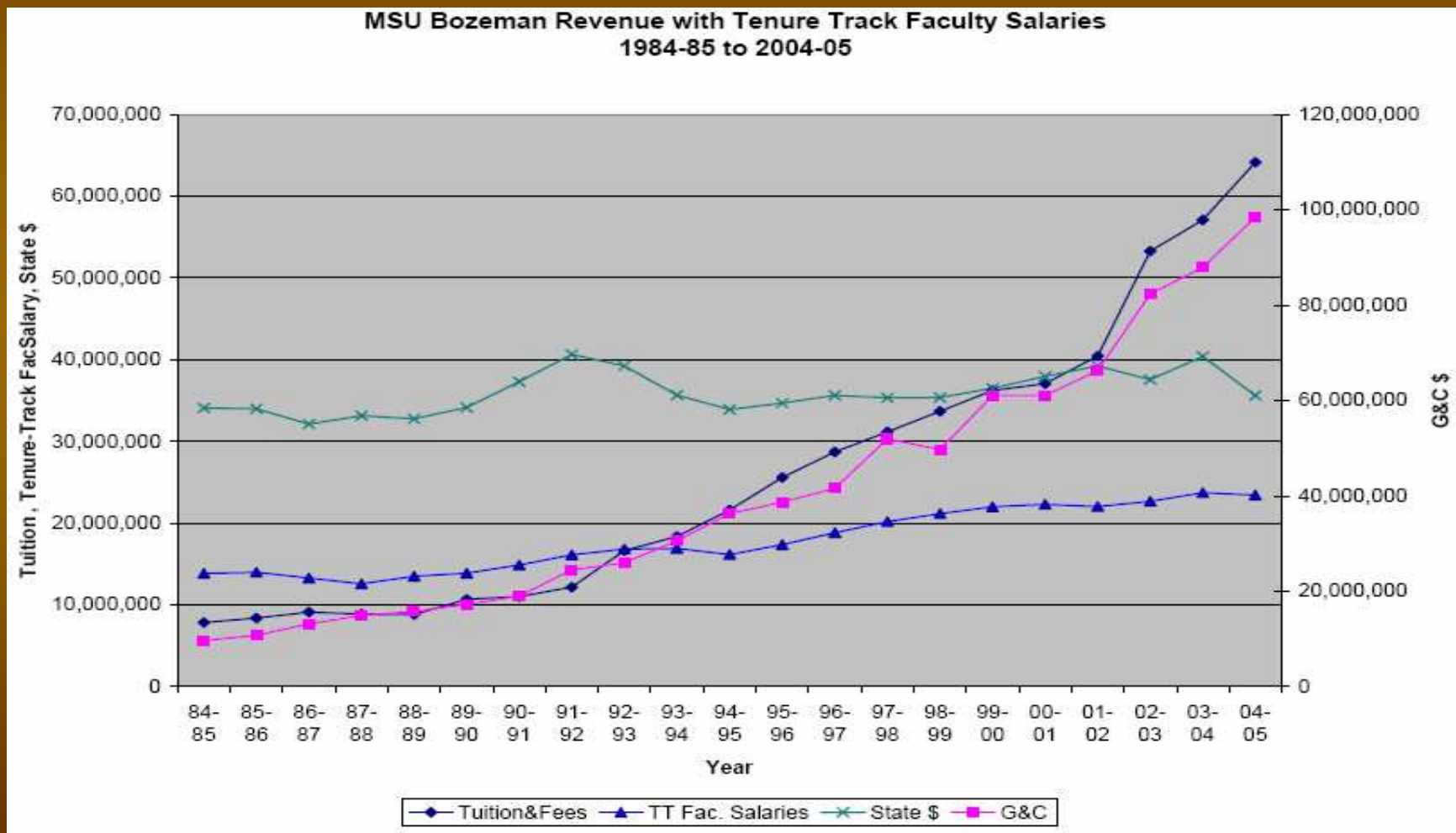



RESEARCH & TUITION



RESEARCH SUMMARY

- IDC collection rate:
 - Maximum rate: 41.5%
 - Actual collection: 18%
 - Research incurs additional cost
 - Is research affecting the student tuition and fees?

RESEARCH UPDATE

- Effect on O&M: (for FY-05 only)
 - Total Assignable Square Feet (ASF) – 13%
 - Estimated plant share – \$2.4 million
 - Actual amount paid - \$250, 779.00
 - Estimated shortfall - \$2.17 million

- Research pays for other items in campus
 - We are working on obtaining the complete picture


NEW BUILDINGS

- Chemistry research facility
 - Federal Ag. research building
 - MSU Ag. research building
 - Parking garage and so on...

- Will increase expenses in areas like
 - Fixed costs, New Staff, O&M, Utilities etc.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- Current tuition increase is sponsored by:
 - Utilities – 20%
 - Property & Liability insurance – 11%
 - Salaries and Benefits – 55%

 - More money should be made available from state to cover these expenses

 - Will the students have to foot the bill for all these developmental activities?

AN EXAMPLE - STAFFING

- Increase in total employees: 324
 - FY 02: 2610
 - FY 05: 2934
- Increase in student FTE: 239.07
 - FY 02: 10218.08
 - FY 05: 10457.15

ATHLETIC FEE INCREASE

- Athletic professional staff FTE increase: 9.2 FTE
 - Year 2002: 34.2 FTE
 - Year 2005: 43.4 FTE
- Total Athletic staff (including professional) FTE increase: 1.4 FTE
 - Year 2002: 52.86 FTE
 - Year 2005: 54.26 FTE
- Still the athletic fee increase last year: \$35


SIMILAR EFFORTS


- The LUMINA Foundation for Education has identified ten criteria to measure academic and non-academic programs at Universities
- New York state declared “affordable and equitable access to a coordinated education system” as their prime goal
- South Carolina instituted performance measures for state appropriations to increase accountability
- There is now a Congressional Committee on the Cost of Higher Education

CURRENT OUTCOMES

- President Gamble agreed to bring a third party from outside to study the research scenario
- Increased communication with administration
 - President Gamble, Dr. Jim Rimpau, Dr. Tom McCoy and so on...
- More awareness among students in the campus about issues concerning them

- The tuition increase is due to:
 - External factors
 - Internal factors
 - We will continue the study and:
 - Submit a final report/documentation to MSU and BOR by next meeting
 - Will attempt at proposing simple performance measures, understandable to students and taxpayers
