<p><i>List one:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Findings Implemented • Completed • <u>In Progress</u> • Beginning <p>Montana Tech started the WIRE (Workgroup for Institutional Realignment for Excellence) group in April – with the goal to define “Special Focus” that will provide us a context for prioritizing programs.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Focus on procedural issues rather than programmatic. Example: “Need more people involved from X unit”</i> <p>WIRE group is making progress and continues to meet with constituent groups internally and externally to gather information.</p> <p>Initially WIRE was following in parallel to the OCHE (Joe Thiel) process, and may be pressed to work faster to meet current and potential budget issues.</p> <p>We had Chris Maples on campus. Chris is the current Missouri S&T president and former OIT president with experience both on prioritization and systems organization.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Specify timeline for completion</i> <p>WIRE has already presented draft concepts regarding Special Focus to both the campus community and the Regents.</p> <p>WIRE will continue to meet and arrive at specific recommendations that are presented during the spring semester before the May BOR meeting.</p> <p>A decision will be made mid spring semester regarding the makeup of a program prioritization committee composed of faculty, staff, and students.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Include best practices garnered from procedure, not specific program areas</i> <p>Getting faculty and staff engaged in the process early and often is critical. There is concern that our program prioritization will be driven more by looming financial issues, rather than as an effort to improve and focus the institution.</p> <p>Montana Tech believes having the WIRE group in place prior to known potential budget problems will benefit the campus.</p> <p>With the designation as Special Focus, we see it critical to determine more specifically where we want to end up at, prior to engaging in the official prioritization process. With that said, the WIRE activities and prioritization have significant overlap.</p>
