Choices That Count (CTC) Pathway Certification Program

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The Choices That Count (CTC) Pathway Certification Program operates as a subset of the MUS Transferable Core (BOR Policy 301.10). In addition to assuring general education block transfer, the CTC Pathway approach simplifies and clarifies the block transfer process.

- The CTC lists a set of specific courses that will count both to satisfy the MUS transferable core, and to meet pre-requisite requirements in specific programs of study;
- Completion of the CTC will be noted on the student transcript to help ensure a smooth transition for students moving from one campus to another within the MUS . [The CTC is a pilot approach that should lead to a common practice at all campuses to note completion of lower division General Education requirements.]
- The CTC ensures that these courses are available at the various campuses and encourages campuses that are missing some of these courses to find cost-effective ways to offer them, especially at the embedded COTs.

The MUS General Education Council has reviewed and endorsed the framework of the CTC Pathway, designed to help student advisers select courses for students in their first two years of study. It will help students make efficient progress towards degree completion. The Council will provide oversight of the CTC Pathway Program as part of its larger oversight mandate for the MUS Transferable Core.
