Governor Steve Bullock served as our commencement speaker in ceremonies Saturday, May, 10, 2014. The ceremony began at 11 a.m. in the Straugh Gymnasium on the UMW campus. This was the 117th commencement for the school that was founded in 1893. A record number of graduates participated in the event and the gymnasium was full of parents and friends of the graduates.
