

Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act of 2014

PL 113-146

- PL 113-146 Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act 2014 (Section 702)
- Requires VA disapproval of programs of education if a school charges non-resident tuition and fees to all covered individuals who live in the state in which the public institution is located
- Effective date July 1, 2015



Covered Individuals

 Covered individuals (Montgomery and Post-9/11 GI Bills Only)



- Veterans who enroll within 3 years of discharge after serving
 90 days or more on active duty
- Spouses and Children using transferred entitlement within 3 years of the transferor's discharge after serving 90 days or more on active duty
- Surviving Spouses or Children under the Fry Scholarship who enroll within 3 years of an active duty Servicemember's death in the line of duty after serving 90 days or more
- Once enrolled, individuals remain covered as long as they are continuously enrolled at the same school



Limitations

- Does not guarantee or require in-State tuition and fee charges to all Ch 33 or Ch 30 recipients
- VA cannot compel a school to charge covered individuals the resident rates
- VA will disapprove the impacted programs if school does not charge resident rates



Summary

- Qualifying individuals basically Post 9/11
 veterans or their dependents who physically
 reside in Montana would be exempt from
 additional residency requirements as it relates
 to tuition and fees other than to physically
 reside in Montana
- If the MUS does not comply, then we would lose VA funding of approximately \$15 million
- The changes from PL 113-146, Section 702 will cause a \$2.5 million reduction in Yellow Ribbon and tuition revenue annually





Next Steps

- Policy language related to residency requirements finalized by legal staff
- Likely exemption to residency requirements to this specific group of students
- Submit proposed policy language to Veterans Administration for approval
- Submit proposed policy language to Board of Regents for approval at May meeting
- Develop a system-wide implementation workgroup
