The nonresident building fee, when compared with the resident building fee, was out of proportion when viewed with respect to the nonresident and resident tuition rates. A \$25 per semester ramp-up over 4 years (for which FY16 and FY17 are the final two years), increases the nonresident building fee by a total of \$100 per semester, making it approximately 350% of the resident building fee, which is approximately the same ratio of nonresident tuition to resident tuition. This increase will ensure that nonresidents can contribute to anticipated needs in addressing deferred maintenance needs, energy improvement initiatives, and classroom renovations.

Per credit fees are stated in increments of a nickel, often resulting in different inflationary increase percentages than intended, due to rounding.

This course runs for five weeks with an intensive dawn-dusk, six-days/week schedule. Accommodations include camping or dorm-style lodging at field sites around the region interspersed with short stays in Bozeman. Total costs for food and lodging are \$50 per day for 30 instructional days, or \$1500 per student. Starting in 2014 the Department of Earth Sciences adopted a new model for GEO429R to help stabilize enrollment by actively recruiting non-MSU students. Over the past several years MSU enrollment has varied between about 12 and 24 students. We plan to recruit non-MSU students to stabilize enrollment at 30-36 students. Larger enrollments will allow us to take advantage of economies of scale to offer the best learning experience at modest cost. Our target minimum enrollment is 30 students, slightly in excess of the 26-student break-even point.

#### Budget Increase Explanation & Justification

Significant changes requested include the addition of a charge for meals (\$358) and the addition of a camp manager/cook position (\$138). The total per diem for each student including costs for the camp manager/cook would be \$16.54/day for 30 instructional days for a total of \$496 attributable to food alone. This is well under the state per diem of \$23/day. In the past, students have purchased and prepared their own meals, and cleaned the camp/cooking facilities. With a camp manager handling these duties, the students will have approximately 2 additional hours per day for academic work, and the sanitation of cooking facilities will be bettermonitored, preventing food-borne illnesses, which have been an issue.

Expenses do not increase linearly with enrollment. Thus, we have calculated the course fee based on a minimum 'break even' enrollment of 26 students. The target enrollment of 30-36 students will provide additional revenue to upgrade equipment and cover unanticipated contingencies. The proposed per-student course-fee of \$1500 covers travel and logistics (\$785), meals for 30 instructional days (\$358 + \$138 camp manager/cook stipend), and equipment & supplies (\$224). Most of these expenses are projected based on previous course costs.

Falling fuel prices were carefully and thoughtfully considered and calculated into this fee request taking into consideration the suddenness of the drop in prices, further anticipated volatility, and the fact that fees are revisited only once every two years. These trip expenses will continue to be monitored in the next biennium and every effort will be made to pass savings along to the student.

Low fuel prices present an opportunity for a richer student experience, in that faculty have requested the addition of a field experience to this course syllabus. As on-line courses now complement traditionally-delivered instruction, and become an integral part of many students' curricula-- not just students in a designated distance program-- a more holistic approach to maintaining and supporting the students and related infrastructure needs to be adopted. The costs for online support services continues to grow as more Montana students and nonresident students choose distributed learning courses and online degree programs. A partial list of additional enhancements necessary to meet the educational requirements of online students includes areas of transactional processes, campus information, distance student support and advising services, business services and instructional technology resources. Fee revenue will be used to defray the additional costs of specialized support services for online and distance students, including technology used to deliver the courses and student support services (24-hour help lines for technical issues, for example).

The Masters Studio Professional project in architecture is divided into two semesters; Arch 575 – Professional Research Paper and Arch 560 – Masters Studio Project. This two semester project is best described and understood as a Masters Studio Professional project with the student taking on all primary responsibility for the aspects of analysis, synthesis, and evaluation during the conception, development and design of a research project within the School of Architecture. Completion of the written document in Arch 575 and the Professional project in Arch 560 is the responsibility of the student with the guidance of a two person faculty committee. The Masters Studio Professional Project is generally considered to be the primary independent experience of a student's overall education within the School of Architecture at Montana State University and should clearly demonstrate the architectural design capabilities of each student. This course, like the other keystone courses in each of the Masters years, should have the program fee assessed on it to ensure that the program fee is assessed to each student once per semester.

### Arch 560 Course Description

This studio is a continuation of ARCH 575-Professional Research Paper and therefore the products produced in ARCH 575 will be used in the development and presentation of the Masters Studio architectural project. This course is intended to be the final architectural studio within the School of Architecture at Montana State University. As the final architectural project in the curriculum, this studio should clearly demonstrate the architectural design capabilities of each student. In this course each student will be required to address the issues of function, form, space, structure, environmental control systems, and context through some combination of drawing and digital/physical models.

This is well under the state per diem of \$23/day. In the past, students have purchased and prepared their own meals, and cleaned the camp/cooking facilities. With a camp manager handling these duties, the students will have approximately 2 additional hours per day for academ work, and the sanitation of cooking facilities will be better- monitored, preventing food-borne illnesses, which have been an issue.  Expenses do not increase linearly with enrollment. Thus, we have calculated the course fee based on a minimum 'break even' enrollment of 26
