## THAT

Upon the occasion of the retirement of Professor Arlene Walker-Andrews from the faculty of the University of Montana, the faculty wishes to express its appreciation for her years of dedicated and valued service by requesting that the rank of Professor Emeritus be conferred upon her by the Board of Regents of Higher Education.

## **EXPLANATION**

Dr. Arlene Walker-Andrews earned her Ph. D. in Psychology in 1980 from Cornell University. She started her distinguished career as a Professor of Developmental Psychology at Rutgers University where she served for 22 years. In 2003, Dr. Walker-Andrews was invited to serve as the Associate Provost and Professor of Psychology at the University of Montana.

Throughout her career, both at Rutgers University and at the University of Montana, Dr. Walker-Andrews distinguished herself as an excellent teacher, an incredibly productive and important researcher and a valuable citizen/administrator of her institution.
