- The FVCC Foundation held its 23rd annual Scholarship Award Luncheon in October to honor scholarship donors and student scholarship recipients. A total of 907 FVCC Foundation and community based scholarships totaling \$897,000 were distributed to FVCC students for the 2016-17 academic year. Student speakers Luke Comstock, Jacqueline Elm, Larissa Fischer and Patrick Kling shared their gratitude and personal stories about the impact scholarships have made on their lives.
- In celebration of the **50th anniversary of FVCC**, the college will release a commemorative publication in January featuring a timeline of significant events, historic photographs and personal testimonials from alumni, faculty, staff and community members.
- The FVCC Foundation awarded more than \$33,000 in **Enhancement Grants** to support innovative instructional strategies and technologies that shift the student learning experience, student travel to present research at conferences and one-time events that engage K-12 schools and the larger community with FVCC's academic programs.
- In support of the Laptops for Success program, FVCC received a \$10,000 grant from the Weyerhaeuser Giving Fund to purchase laptop computers for use by TRIO students. Students can borrow the laptops on a semester-by-semester basis.
- Eight graduates of the **Registered Nursing** program were honored in a traditional pinning ceremony on December 15.
- Nineteen graduates of **The Culinary Institute of Montana at FVCC** were honored at a graduation ceremony on December 13.

- FVCC's Agriculture Program hosted the 14th Annual **Montana Organic Association Conference** and member meeting on the Kalispell campus. The theme of this year's conference was "The Heartbeat of Organics: Stimulating the Pulse of Our Producers, Consumers and Policymakers" and included presentations by a variety of organic agriculture experts, including farmers, researchers, policy analysts and business specialists.
- FVCC student **Kiera Lake** received the **Montana Athletes in Service Award** from Gov. Bullock and the Montana Campus Compact Board. Kiera is a member of FVCC's logger sports team and gives generously of her time to several local nonprofit organizations.
- The Corporation for National and Community Service recently named FVCC to the **President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll** for the college's support of volunteering, service learning and civic engagement.
- Nearly 30 FVCC students presented their research projects during the college's fall **Conference on Student Research**. The event provided students the opportunity to present their research, portfolios and projects to faculty, staff, students and community members.
- FVCC's Theatre Arts department produced "A Christmas Carol" in December. The show ran for six nights and was well attended by the community.
- FVCC's Fine Arts department held a **student show and holiday art sale** in December.
- FVCC's Music department produced several **free community concerts** this fall, featuring the vocal and instrumental talents of students and faculty members.
- FVCC's Service Learning program hosted a holiday cookie decorating event for local non-profit agencies. Members of the community were invited to help decorate the cookies. Service Learning students also collected holiday gifts for children represented by Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) for Kids.
- FVCC's **Phi Theta Kappa** chapter organized a **coat drive** to collect winter garments for community members in need.
- The FVCC Veterans Association hosted a Halloween Trunk or Treat for the community. The free, family-friendly event featured decorated vehicle trunks filled with treats for guests to enjoy.
