## **REPORT:**

Dawson Community College is talking with potential key partners to develop "ownership" opportunities for our students in the fields of agriculture and business. In an effort to keep Montanans in Montana, this new and innovative structure is designed to help our graduates pursue their dreams of eventual ag or business ownership. Additionally, we hope to develop agriculture or business ownership pathways for our out-of-state graduates who wish to become Montana residents.



- Dawson Community College has recently restructured its food service. A contract with a new
  provider has been issued and additional changes have been made to more adequately meet the
  needs of our students. This is a step in the right direction to ensure our students have full
  nutritious meals while at DCC.
- Dawson continues to grow its partnerships to serve the youth of Montana. Our recent initiative
  assists underserved populations (homeless/unaccompanied youth or youth aging out of the foster
  care system) to obtain a debt-free education. Students can learn a trade and graduate ready to
  enter the workforce or be prepared to transfer to a four-year institution having completed their
  general education requirements. Our holistic approach supports these students upon graduation
  from high school, through earning their certificate or degree and most importantly, keeping them
  in Montana to add value and leadership to our Montana workforce.
- The DC Foundation has been very active in its outreach and fundraising efforts. In the past
  month, the Foundation has received thousands of dollars in donations and pledges for the
  creation of three new endowments.
- Last spring, Dawson developed a new strategic plan, an action plan, and a rough draft of new Key Performance Indicators (KPI). The KPI's are undergoing a final review and, within the next several weeks, we will begin using the newly structured KPI's to help measure and analyze our progress toward meeting the goals of the core themes.
