Notification of placing the Applied and Psychological Science option in moratorium

THAT

Montana State University is notifying the Board of Regents that we propose eliminating the currently separate Applied and Psychological Science options in the undergraduate psychology degree.

EXPLANATION

This is an artificial dichotomy and incorrectly leads students to infer both that (a) clinical or counseling psychologists do not need to understand research and that (b) psychology researchers do not perform applied work. Because of this misunderstanding, students choosing the applied concentration complain about needing to take research and statistics classes and students wishing to make a difference in their communities steer away from potential research careers. Our end-of-semester assessments of student satisfaction with our program have highlighted these misguided opinions, and we believe such misperceptions can create dissatisfaction with our program and MSU. In our department retreat this spring, the faculty voted unanimously to eliminate the separate options.

Proposal Summary [360 words maximum]

What: The department currently offers a bachelor of science degree in psychology with two options: psychological science or applied psychology. We propose eliminating the applied and psychological science options to offer the same bachelor of science degree in psychology for all majors.

Why: This is an artificial dichotomy and incorrectly leads students to infer both that (a) clinical or counseling psychologists do not need to understand research and that (b) psychology researchers do not perform applied work. Because of this misunderstanding, students choosing the applied concentration complain about needing to take research and statistics classes and students wishing to make a difference in their communities steer away from potential research careers. Our end-of-semester assessments of student satisfaction with our program have highlighted these misguided opinions, and we believe such misperceptions can create dissatisfaction with our program and MSU. In our department retreat this spring, the faculty voted unanimously to eliminate the separate options.

Resources: The current options contain an identical curriculum except for a single class typically taken junior year. Those in Psychological Science are encouraged to take Psyx 490 (undergrad research) and those in the Applied Psychology option are encouraged to take Psyx 495 (field practicum). These two classes will still be available and advisors will encourage students to take either or both, depending upon their preferred future career.

Relationship to similar MUS programs: This consolidation into an overall psychology degree will not affect our curriculum at all and does not add or delete any classes. Therefore our program's relation to other MUS programs will remain unchanged. In fact, UM also psychology does not have separate concentrations.

Why

Currently, this is the only Master's in Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) in the state of Montana. There is a need for a distance program because FCS professionals are working throughout the state and need FCS graduate education to keep their current employment opportunities. For example, FCS Extension Agents can be hired with a Bachelor's degree, but are contracted to receive a master's degree within 3-5 years. Providing a distance option directly aids in meeting the university's land grant mission by providing needed education for Extension Agents within their discipline. The distance option will also aid FCS professionals who are working in middle schools/high schools, non-profit, and government agencies across the state have the opportunity to advance in their careers.

Dawson Community College is proposing revising its existing A.A.S degree in Agribusiness Technology program to an A.A.S. degree in Animal Science with two program options: <u>Animal Science</u>: <u>Livestock Production</u> and <u>Animal Science</u>: <u>Equitation</u>. This change reflects changes in curriculum to add more animal science and production courses and reduce the focus on general education and business-related courses.

Proposal Summary [360 words maximum]

This change is based on student interest in having a deeper focus on Animal Science based on exploring livestock production tactics as a career option. Additionally, the need of a meat science program also played a role in the shift in program curriculum and name change. As we move forward with the development of a meat processing plant in eastern Montana, we will have a need to produce more students with a production background.

Dawson Community College is proposing revising its existing A.A.S degree in Agribusiness Technology program to an A.A.S. degree in Animal Science with two program options: <u>Animal Science: Livestock Production</u> and <u>Animal Science: Equitation</u>. This change reflects changes in curriculum to add more animal science and livestock production & management courses and reduce the focus on general education and business-related courses.

DCC has always been committed to providing education and training opportunities in a way that meets the changing needs of our students and community. We have a history of exploring innovative ways to engage our target population of students while considering the broader needs of our local workforce and employers.

This program seeks to address a need for students interested in working in animal science and livestock production & management.

DCC's mission is to provide affordable and open access to quality teaching and learning. Specifically, revising the Associate of Applied Science in Agribusiness Technology program to Animal Science fits within the following established DCC Core Themes:

- Expanding opportunities in education adaptive to the needs of a changing student body.
- Provide opportunities for workforce development, apprenticeships and internships, continuing education, personal enrichment and youth programming.
- 3. Process leading to submission. Briefly detail the planning, development, and approval process of the program at the institution. [100 words]

A proposal for the revision of the Associate of Applied Science in Agribusiness Technology program was submitted to President Mickelsen for review. The curriculum changes were reviewed by the Agriculture Advisory Committee and approved on April 24, 2018.

The Animal Science program at Dawson Community College prepares students for successful careers and a lifetime of informed choices in agriculture with a focus on Animal Science, food, fiber, and natural resource industries. Students develop knowledge, skills, and experience in agricultural science, production and business practices to manage animals. The curriculum developed will give students a solid ground in scientific principles emphasizing sustainability practices that will successfully prepare students for careers in the Animal Science and production industries.

The Livestock Production concentration trains students for employment in traditional broad-based animal agriculture such as livestock production, business, and services related to livestock. Ranching, extension, livestock consultants, market livestock analysis, meat grading, and animal recreationists are additional October 2018

examples of some of the professional opportunities available. The Equitation concentration is for students who have an interest in working in the horse industry and includes training towards knowledge and skills in horsemanship, training, safe horse handling, and husbandry.

An AAS in Animal Science with Livestock Production concentration will:

- 1. Give students a basic understanding of the role of livestock in agriculture, introduce basic concepts & principles of animal nutrition, growth, health, behavior, repro, and genetics.
- 2. Introduce commercial applications: ration formulation, disease, prevention, Al, genetic selection and crossbreeding systems as well as agriculture business and technology.
- 3. Familiarize students with a broad scope of disciplines and opportunities that exist in the agriculture industry and their contribution to society.
- Students will build a strong knowledge base in the field of Agriculture and practical skilled-based exposure in its related industries (Animal Sciences, Range and Soil Sciences, Business and Marketing)
- Expose students to courses in computation, communications, and human relations, and will assist students in developing an understanding and appreciation for diversity, social responsibility and the participation in public affairs.
- 6. Provide students with opportunities for practical experience in the Agriculture system via internships, fieldwork, and skills-based course offerings.
- 7. Assist students in the development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills, and the ability to conceptualize ideas.

With an AAS in Animal Science with Equitation concentration:

- Students will build a strong knowledge base in the field of Ag/Equine Science and practical skilledbased exposure in its related industries (Animal Sciences, Equine Sciences, Range and Soil Sciences, Business and Marketing).
- Give the student the opportunity to demonstrate knowledge, skills, attitudes, and practical
 experiences for entry-level employment or self-employment in the equine and agricultural
 industry segments.

According to the Montana Department of Labor & Industry, Montana has the highest rate of business ownership among households, with 21% of Montana households reporting income from a business or a farm¹. Many students interested in working or starting a business in agriculture industries may not have access to technology and training available through a program, like the one proposed by DCC.

Students expressed interest in a deeper focus on Animal Science based on exploring livestock production tactics as a career option. The original program title, Agribusiness Technology, deflected student interest as a "business" field is not a top choice of study for many student interested in the programming, where Animal Science more accurately reflects the program and career focus.

Glendive is a huge agriculture community and the GATE committee expressed interest in the development of a program that strongly emphasized sustainable agriculture in hopes of filling employment opportunities in local industry. Additionally, the need of a meat science program also played a role in the shift in program curriculum and name change. As we move forward with the development of a meat processing plant in eastern Montana, we will have a need to produce more students with a production background.

While there are some similarities between the proposed AAS in Animal Science and the AS in Livestock Management offered at Miles Community College, there are also noticeable differences. Namely, the MCC program is an AS transfer degree with a focus on MUS core and an overview of livestock and animal science coursework while the renamed DCC program is a terminal A.A.S. degree that includes specialized skills in Animal Husbandry, Calving Management, & Meat Evaluation. These specific courses are not offered elsewhere in the MUS.

Similarly, while there are comparable course offerings in MCC's A.A.S. in Agriculture Production, that program looks overall at both plants and animal sciences related to agricultural industry as well as the business aspect of farm and ranch management. That program more closely resembles the previous DCC A.A.S. in Agribusiness which we are proposing to revise to Animal Science to reflect the new targeted program emphasis on animal science and livestock production & management.

b. Describe any efforts that were made to collaborate with similar programs at other institutions. If no efforts were made, please explain why. [200 words]

The original intent was to rename the Associate of Applied Science in Agribusiness Technology program to Livestock Production Management. Because of concerns that this retitle could draw attention away from or cause confusion with existing programs in the MUS, and to address the addition of new courses, DCC has proposed this program revision to Animal Science instead. This will address concerns while maintaining the programmatic goals of the change.

7. Implementation of the program. When will the program be first offered? If implementation will occur in phases, please describe the phased implementation plans. [100 words]

The proposed curriculum changes will be implemented starting in Spring 2019.

This revision proposal is for an existing program with a student cohort that is already engaged in the program. Projections are based on historical enrollments since the original program's inception.

c. What is the initial capacity for the program?

Since this proposal is a revision of an existing program that has been in operation for several years, the initial capacity is the same as the current existing capacity.

Success of the programs will be determined by the student learning outcomes completed each semester that is used for curriculum mapping and an annual report that is evaluated and reviewed by the Assessment Committee. Program review is completed every three years. There are three actions that can be taken: program continuance; additional information with an action plan; program discontinuance.

a. Describe the assessment process that will be used to evaluate how well students are achieving the intended learning outcomes of the program. When will assessment activities occur and at what frequency? [150 words]

Faculty and adjuncts will use a template for identification of SLO's, the direct measure for assessment and a benchmark of success for each outcome. The report conforms to the college template and contains:

- a. The list of SLOs by course
- b. The assessment measure used for each SLO
- c. Assessment results student progress towards achieving the SLO
- d. An explanation of how the results are used to improve student learning

SLO reports are due by January 15 for fall courses and by June 15 for spring courses. The reports are compiled and submitted to the AVP to evaluate results and assist faculty in improving outcomes, if necessary.

The DCC assessment committee will then be responsible for reviewing the annual report which documents the number of SLO's assessed, the number of SLO's which ranked below three on the indirect measure, and the percentage of courses which were assessed for SLO's.

b. What direct and indirect measures will be used to assess student learning? [100 words]

The direct measure of assessment will be the assessment reports on the student learning outcomes that are completed by faculty and adjuncts each semester. An indirect measure will be the student evaluation of instruction that are completed for each class each semester.

c. How will you ensure that the assessment findings will be used to ensure the quality of the program? [100 words]

The assessment reports are first compiled by faculty and adjuncts, which allows them to see the data first. It will then be reviewed by the AVP and Assessment Committee. Faculty will also see a summary of the student evaluation of instruction to determine areas of improvement.

Proposal Summary [360 words maximum]

What

The Management Information Systems (MIS) faculty in the College of Business (COB) propose an undergraduate Certificate in Cybersecurity Management. This certificate is designed to align with the Cyber Defense knowledge units developed by the National Security Agency/Department of Homeland Security (NDS/DHS) for information assurance. Students will gain skills in programming; networking technology & protocols; databases & analytics; probability & statistics; policy, legal, ethics, and compliance; cybersecurity fundamentals & practices, and cybersecurity management & planning. Students who earn the Cybersecurity Management certificate will work for companies as consultants, Chief Information Officers, or Chief Security Officers focusing on the management issues around cybersecurity. This certificate requires 18 credits in cybersecurity and supporting areas.

Why

MIS Advisory Board members, which include representatives from KPMG, Microsoft, Washington Corporation, PwC, ATG, and LMG Security, stress that finding employees with skills in the cybersecurity area is one of their top priorities. Organizations have immediate openings for students with managerial skills in cybersecurity. Many of these companies provide consulting services for other businesses and organizations to help them comply with laws and regulations, develop policies and procedures to increase security to meet business demands, and provide services to handle security breaches when they occur. Currently, graduates of the MIS program place at a 94% rate, with some of the highest starting salaries across campus (offers exceeding \$60,000 are not unusual). The proposed certificate will help graduates be even more competitive in high-demand market.

Resources

The proposed Cybersecurity Management Certificate leverages existing courses and resources. The two required courses (BMIS 471 and BMIS 472) are MIS electives, meaning they may be offered at the department's discretion. Approving the certificate would require the department to offer each course at least once per academic year. MIS

currently offers each course once per year to meet existing student demand, so this will not require additional resources.

Relationship to similar MUS programs

Missoula College currently offers a Cybersecurity Certificate, which provides the technical skills needed to respond to cybersecurity events, as well as deploy technical solutions to improve cybersecurity in organizations. The proposed Cybersecurity Management Certificate focuses on managerial aspects, such as identifying, protecting, detecting, responding to, and recovering from cybersecurity incidents. The certificate may encourage Missoula College students to work towards a bachelor's degree, or to obtain a second certificate focusing on management issues.

What

The Public Policy certificate offers public employees fundamental and advanced skills that enhance the level of datadriven decision-making in public service organizations.

Why

The certificate provides the basic, core, fundamental policy-related classes within the MPA program for those interested in advancing their public policy skills. It requires 12 credits, is aimed at pre-career and mid-career professionals at various levels of federal, state, or local government, and will be delivered online or in-person using existing courses from the Master of Public Administration (MPA) program. The certificate has been discussed with the Director of the Max S. Baucus Institute, local officials from the City of Missoula/Missoula County, state and tribal officials. There is a strong interest in the certificate for employees, specifically policy/data analysts. There are no costs involved in delivering the certificate since all of the classes currently exist and are taught on a routine basis within the MPA program. The targeted market for the certificate would be public employees in the state and Rocky Mountain West, and would provide a service to the State of Montana and region.

Resources

The UM MPA recently implemented a program fee to aid in programming support. In addition, the Baucus Institute where the MPA program will be housed provides financial support for programming. The coursework is already part of the normal rotation of classes for the UM MPA program.

Relationship to similar MUS programs

The UM MPA program offers coursework online, in-person, or a combination. MSU-Bozeman offers a relatively small inperson only MPA program. A public policy emphasis/certificate does not currently exist. This would be first of its kind for the state.

In order to address the ongoing need for well-prepared, highly skilled rural health care providers, the creation of the Certificate of Rural Health Leadership will prepare health care providers for the complex challenges that are unique to the provision of health care in rural areas. Due to the interprofessional nature of this certificate program, the College of Health Professions and Biomedical Sciences will administer the certificate and utilize courses and faculty throughout its units for the 12-credit curriculum.

Why

By offering students the opportunity to complete an interprofessional Certificate of Rural Health Leadership, CHPBS aims to train health professionals who will have the skills and resiliency to personally and professionally excel in frontier and rural health care systems. This program will focus on increasing knowledge about the unique characteristics of rural populations and health care systems and common social/societal determinants of health. Beyond this knowledge, the certificate will develop individual skills in interprofessional collaborative practice, communication, leadership, and management. These skills are essential for a rural health care provider to succeed in the multiple roles they play in low-resource settings.

Resources

Existing resources are sufficient to support this certificate program.

Relationship to similar MUS programs

There are no other graduate certificate programs that specifically address the skills and knowledge needed for success in rural health care provision. The University of Montana School of Public and Community Health Sciences offers a Certificate of Public Health as well as a Certificate of Global Health. However, these current certificates are more general in nature and are not focused on rural health care.

What: Re-titling the M.S. and Ph.D. Degrees in the Merged Department of Microbiology and Immunology to M.S. (Plan "A"), M.S. (Plan "B"), and Ph.D. in Microbiology and Immunology.

Why: In 2013, the Department of Microbiology and the Department of Immunology & Infectious Diseases received Montana Board of Regents approval to merge, resulting in the formation of the Department of Microbiology and Immunology at MSU. Before merging, each department maintained M.S. and Ph.D. degrees with the same titles and the original department names. With completion of the merger and stable department operation, we established a combined and unified graduate program. However, the graduate program names were not changed at the time of the merger. Over the past two years, the department has considered and reconsidered the need to consolidate our graduate program names. Two separate votes of the departmental faculty concluded that it is now necessary to re-title these existing graduate programs from the two former departments to coincide with the new department name and the unified/merged graduate program. Hereby, we request approval to re-title our unified degrees to M.S. (Plans A and B) and Ph.D. in Microbiology and Immunology. In addition to the votes of our faculty group, a recent external reviewer of the entire department in 2018 also provided input on this issue. In their review, the external reviewers indicated the following: "There is overwhelming support for unification of the two graduate programs into a single Microbiology and Immunology Ph.D. This is viewed as an opportunity by the faculty to increase transparency for the students." Their specific recommendation was as follows: "The request and justification for unification of the two graduate programs into a single Microbiology and Immunology Ph.D. should be resubmitted to the Graduate School." Thus, based on the consideration of our unanimous faculty approval and the recommendations of the external review committee, we are requesting approval of our request to change our degree programs to M.S. in Microbiology and Immunology Plan A, M.S. in Microbiology and Immunology Plan B, and Ph.D. in Microbiology and Immunology.
