## MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY | BOZEMAN

Montana State University has once again been designated a university with <u>very high research activity</u> by the Indiana University Center for Postsecondary Research's Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education. MSU is one of 130 universities nationwide — out of 4,338 U.S. higher education institutions — to be included in this category.

Suzanne Held and Alma McCormick, co-directors of a collaborative partnership between MSU and members of the Apsáalooke (Crow) Nation of rural southeastern Montana were <u>recognized nationally for their work to promote</u> <u>health equity and social justice</u> by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

Researchers at MSU are leading a \$2 million grant across a four-state region to attack a major hardship in organic farming: perennial weeds.

An MSU-led expedition <u>made international headlines</u> following the unexpected discovery of the remains of tiny animals in a lake beneath more than a half mile of Antarctic ice.

MSU online <u>online master's degree program</u> in environmental sciences delivers access to students in wild places.

<u>Entrepreneurial opportunities</u> in the Jake Jabs College of Business and Entrepreneurship were highlighted in an article in BizEd magazine, which went to 51,000 readers globally.

A long-running research project at MSU to build radiation-tolerant computers to help NASA has produced a way to turn random impacts from cosmic radiation into a cybersecurity tool.

MSU Architecture professor Maire O'Neill Conrad received the John N. DeHaas Memorial Award for Outstanding Service to Historic Preservation for her projects, education and training contributions to Montana's historic preservation.

MSU was <u>designated a Bee Campus USA</u> by the Xerces Society for Invertebrate Conservation, the first Montana campus to qualify. The designation recognizes university's pollinator-friendly practices and programs.

A new <u>partnership between MSU Leadership Institute and the city of Bozeman</u> has provided an outreach opportunity for civil engineering graduate student Heather Nold. For a year, Nold will meet regularly with the Bozeman mayor to learn about public service at the municipal level and look into strategies for helping the city manage its water supply.

Wan-Yuan Kuo, head of MSU's new Food Product Development Laboratory, and her students have been working with Harlowton-based Cream of the West to improve the company's pancakes, which are served in MSU dining halls through the Farm to Campus program.
