What We are proposing to retitle our current existing Bachelor of Science in Health & Human Performance to Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology.

Why Four years ago the Health and Human Performance faculty at Montana Western undertook a realignment of program outcomes and course requirements with the American Kinesiology Association Core Elements and Learning Outcomes. These learning outcomes have been used in assessment efforts for the past four years and we are seeing strong alignment between our course requirements and the nationally reviewed outcomes.

Throughout the country awareness of the term Kinesiology is increasing with an understanding of the broad scope of the field. This increasing awareness has led to more potential students seeking out Kinesiology programs as a path to graduate studies or professional pursuits. Retitling our program to better reflect the Kinesiology focus of our degree will increase visibility and enhance marketability of our degree.

What: Minor in Farm and Ranch Operations as a choice of focus for B.S. in Business Administration Students.

Why: The purpose of this minor is to support Business Administration students interested in farm and ranch operations and management. It is a response to an expanding job market for farm and ranch mangers and provides further educational opportunities in Beaverhead county which has over 400 farms with one million acres of farm and ranch land in addition to being one of the largest cattle producing counties in Montana

Resources: This minor will be taught as a collaboration between the Business and Technology department faculty and the Equine Studies faculty.

Relationship to similar MUS programs: While a BS in Agricultural Business with a concentration in Farm and Ranch Management exists at MSU Bozeman, the MSU program according to their catalog description focuses strongly on the agricultural, biological, and economic focus of farm and ranch management. The University of Montana Western's Farm and Ranch Operations focus primarily on business administration and animal science aspect of farm and ranch. In addition as previously mentioned, this program focuses on a service to the surrounding community of Beaverhead County.

The University of Montana Western's Bachelor of Science in Business Administration is proposing a new 32credit minor in Farm and Ranch Operations. This minor will be available to students pursuing the Business Administration degree and will be a collaboration between the faculty in the Business and Technology and Equine Studies Departments. There will be no changes to the major core of the Business Administration program as this will be a minor students can select to accompany their major.

2. Relation to institutional strategic goals. Describe the nature and purpose of the new program in the context of the institution's mission and core themes. [200 words]

As a part of the Business Administration major, this proposal expands the programs support of the mission statement to "achieve academic excellence by sustaining a culture of concentrated experiential education" and supports core theme one "Continuously improve undergraduate education and experiential learning." Students taking the business core learn important business content areas such as accounting, marketing, management, human resources, and finance while incorporating a "hands-on" approach to farm and ranch operations including animal science, animal reproduction and nutrition, soils, technology and other areas related to farm and ranch operations to promote positive sustainable use of resources for generations to come.

In addition, this proposal supports the University's regional mission as it is responding to a need requested and established by local farms and ranches, and businesses that support agriculture in Beaverhead County and rural Montana in general. Farms and ranches and businesses that support them, are looking for a Montana opportunity to support their growth and development.

During the 2018-19 academic year, the curriculum proposal advanced through the campus approval process including: an approval by the department; initial approval by the Provost for resource consideration and need of program; a review by the campus department chairs; approval by faculty senate; concluding with a final approval from the Provost and the Chancellor.

The University of Montana Western has a long history of educating rural Montana students through their business department. These students have asked for the addition of basic agricultural courses to supplement and support the business education Montana Western provides. This addition is intended to serve that request and help those students with the skills needed to successfully run Montana farms, ranches and related businesses.

With an expanding job market for qualified farm and ranch managers and managers of business supporting the Ag industry in general, students taking the business core learn important business content areas such as accounting, marketing, management, human resources, business strategy, and finance while incorporating a "hands-on" approach to farm and ranch operations including animal science, animal reproduction and nutrition, soils, technology and other areas related to farm and ranch operations to promote positive sustainable use of resources for generations to come.

The University of Montana Western is situated in Beaverhead County which has over 400 farms with over 1 million acres of farm and ranch land and is one of the largest cattle producing counties in Montana. This creates a unique experiential opportunity for students through field experiences, practicums and internships.

While a BS in Agricultural Business with a concentration in Farm and Ranch Management exists at MSU Bozeman, the MSU program, is based in the School of Agriculture unlike this program which is based in the Business Department.

MSU Northern offers a BS in Agriculture Operations Technology. MSU-Northern agriculture school's coursework, according to their website, integrates agricultural sciences, agribusiness, and related applied technologies.

This program is not intended to duplicate the above programs but will provide a net benefit to the State and its citizens because this Minor will predominately target students that want a business degree but with exposure to farm and ranch operations course work. It is anticipated that graduates may be interested in Ag productions careers and businesses that support the Ag producers. The University of Montana Western's Farm and Ranch Operations proposed Minor will be a set of classes that provide an overview of specific areas in farm and ranch operations such as animal science, soils and water, crops and soils, and marketing. This program focuses on a service to the surrounding community of Beaverhead County and rural Montana. Beaverhead County and the surrounding area have seen an increased demand in recent years for non-owner farm and ranch managers. This Minor option will provide knowledge and skills to those students seeking to manage or establish agriculture-related businesses.

b. Describe any efforts that were made to collaborate with similar programs at other institutions. If no efforts were made, please explain why. [200 words]

The Minor described in this proposal is unique to the business program at the University of Montana Western and is not appropriate or practical to offer collaboratively. The program does bring together the Business, Equine and Science programs at Montana Western to collaborate on the courses offered and utilize the expertise available on campus. This is intended to be a business degree offered with an exposure to agriculture and not an agricultural or science degree.

The University of Montana Western has not sought to collaborate with the other programs at other institutions, as we were able to establish a collaboration between the Business Department and the Equine Department here on campus to teach the classes contained in the minor. Between the Equine and Business departments all of the courses except for two can be taught by existing faculty that are qualified to teach the classes. Those two courses will need to be taught by an adjunct or a faculty member from another department on campus.

This minor will be available in the Fall 2019 semester.

This headcount calculation is based on the average new enrollment in the Business Administration program each year, the choices of minors and options within the program, and the graduation headcount each year of the program with the various minors and options.

Success will be determined by having an adequate number of students enrolled in the Minor. If the student headcount is adequate to cover the costs associated with offering the classes in the Minor then it will be considered a success. If enrollment is low in the Minor, the Minor would be placed on moratorium and ultimately the Minor would not be offered anymore.

a. Describe the assessment process that will be used to evaluate how well students are achieving the intended learning outcomes of the program. When will assessment activities occur and at what frequency? [150 words]

The assessment process to evaluate how well students are achieving the intended learning outcomes will follow the same assessment process that is currently used to evaluate our current business program. The students are currently evaluated using both direct and indirect measures at various points as the students progress through their degree.

b. What direct and indirect measures will be used to assess student learning? [100 words]

Some of the direct measures currently used are oral/written assessment through standard, departmentdeveloped rubrics. In addition, a standardized, nationally-normed exam (Peregrine Academic Services) is administered to every senior student in the capstone (BMGT 499) course.

Some of the indirect measures to be used are an internship supervisor review and an exit survey. The exit survey is conducted at the conclusion of every internship and/or thesis presentation.

c. How will you ensure that the assessment findings will be used to ensure the quality of the program? [100 words]

At a minimum once a year, after all of the assessment data is collected, the faculty in the Business Department meet to review the data collected from the direct and indirect measures and make changes to the curriculum to ensure that the student learning outcomes are being met.

While there is no specialized accreditation for the Minor area, the Business Program is externally accredited by the International Accreditation Council for Business Education (IACBE). Through the IACBE accreditation, this Minor will be reviewed and the learning outcomes will need to be assessed within the parameters set by the IACBE.

It is not anticipated that there will be any adverse impact on the current physical resources nor is it anticipated that new facilities, equipment and space will be needed as there are currently adequate facilities, equipment and space for the increased utilization of physical resources used by this Minor. The Business and Equine Department have the capacity to adequately and successfully implement the Minor.

No new facilities, equipment or space are needed to successfully implement this Minor. However, the Business and Equine departments will seek out relationships with area farms and ranches to allow the use of their resources to provide practical experiential learning activities.

The Business and Equine departments will use their existing instructional resources to successfully implement the Minor. It is anticipated that through more efficient course scheduling there will be little impact on the current program and the current quality of the other programs will not be affected.

What: Minor in Outdoor Guide and Wildlife Outfitter Enterprise Management for B.S. in Business Administration Students.

Why: The purpose of this minor is to support the growing sector of the outfitting industry in Montana's economy (source: <u>https://scholarworks.umt.edu/cgi/viewcontent.cgi?article=1376&context=itrr_pubs</u>). A minor focusing on the outfitter industry tied with the university's Bachelor of Science in Business Administration will provide students both the business knowledge and wildlife experience to support this growing industry.

Resources: This minor is a collaboration between the Business and Technology, Biology, Equine Studies, and Environmental Science Departments at the University of Montana Western. Outside of the addition of a two credit course, all courses required in this minor are currently offered as part of each of these departments teaching load. Because of this collaboration and the university geographic location, the university is perfectly situated to provide this minor.

Relationship to similar MUS programs: There are programs that focus on Tourism and Recreation Management at the University of Montana, but the specific focus of Outdoor Guide and Wildlife Outfitter Enterprise would be unique to the University of Montana Western.

The University of Montana Western's Bachelor of Science in Business Administration is proposing a new thirty-four credit minor in Outdoor Guide and Wildlife Outfitter Enterprise Management. This minor will be available to students pursuing the Business Administration degree and will be a collaboration between the faculty in the Business and Technology and Equine Studies, Biology, and Environmental Sciences departments. There will be no changes to the major core of the Business Administration program as this will be a minor students can select to accompany their major.

2. Relation to institutional strategic goals. Describe the nature and purpose of the new program in the context of the institution's mission and core themes. [200 words]

As a part of the Business Administration major, this proposal expands the programs support of the mission statement to "achieve academic excellence by sustaining a culture of concentrated experiential education" and supports core theme one "Continuously improve undergraduate education and experiential learning." It is the intent of this minor to apply Montana Western's experiential learning niche to support this important and growing workforce sector of Montana's economy. This niche provides a unique opportunity to give students on the ground experience in both business and outfitter practices.

In addition, this proposal supports core theme three "Foster responsible campus efficiency and stewards of resources." This minor is a collaboration of the Business and Technology, Equine Studies, Biology, and Environmental Studies department and utilizes existing courses across each program to create the minor. The only new course will be a two credit course, all others currently exist in the curriculum. Utilizing existing courses make strategic use of instructional resources and helps increase enrollment in courses. The University of Montana western is also located in a primary position to take advantage or local geographic resources to support the minor

This minor would support a growing and important workforce of Montana's economy by providing both business management and outfitter and wildlife education and skills through an experiential and interactive environment. Montana's Western experiential learning specifically provides the hands on experience and skills to support this sector.

In a report released in November, 2018 from the Institute for Tourism and Recreation Research at the University of Montana entitled: Montana 's Outfitting Industry - 2017 Economic Contribution and Industry-Client Analysis, it discusses the impact of the guides and outfitters on Montana's economy. The abstract states:

"In recent years, nonresident visitor spending on outfitters and guides has surpassed that of spending on retail goods, making it the fourth highest spending category behind only fuel, lodging, and dining out. This rise comes despite only five to six percent of the visiting population taking part in these activities. This observation reiterates findings from the 2007 Montana Outfitter and Guide study characterizing the outfitting industry as high value, low impact.

CURRICULUM PROPOSAL FORM

The 1,450 identifiable entities providing guided and outfitted services generate an average of \$158,900 in revenue while serving 728,900 clients, 63 percent of whom are from out of state. These activities take place across a wide spectrum of landscapes and waterways. Sixty-one percent of land based activities utilized public lands. USFS and BLM lands led the way with 32 and 20 percent respectively of outfitted trips. When it comes to Montana's waterways, 79 percent of responding outfitters indicated their activities relied in some fashion on waterways."

Because of the variety of course options and the fact the BS in Business Administration already exists, this minor could have a larger capacity, but for now it is projected at 20 students.

Success will be determined by having an adequate number of students enrolled in the Minor. If the student headcount is adequate to cover the costs associated with offering the classes in the Minor then it will be considered a success. If enrollment is low in the Minor, the Minor would be placed on moratorium and ultimately the Minor would not be offered anymore.

The assessment process to evaluate how well students are achieving the intended learning outcomes will follow the same assessment process that is currently used to evaluate our current business program. The students are currently evaluated using both direct and indirect measures at various points as the student's progress through their degree.

Some of the direct measures currently used are oral/written assessment through standard, departmentdeveloped rubrics. In addition, a standardized, nationally-normed exam (Peregrine Academic Services) is administered to every senior student in the capstone (BMGT 499) course.

Some of the indirect measures to be used are an internship supervisor review and an exit survey. The exit survey is conducted at the conclusion of every internship and/or thesis presentation.

c. How will you ensure that the assessment findings will be used to ensure the quality of the program? [100 words]

At a minimum of once a year, after all of the assessment data is collected, the faculty in the Business department meet to review the data collected from the direct and indirect measures and make changes to the curriculum to ensure that the student learning outcomes are being met.

While there is no specialized accreditation for the Minor area, the Business Program is externally accredited by the International Accreditation Council for Business Education (IACBE). Through the IACBE accreditation, this Minor will be reviewed and the learning outcomes will need to be assessed within the parameters set by the IACBE.
