MSU's <u>fall enrollment</u> totals 16,766 students, the second highest headcount ever recorded. Of those, 9,911 are Montana residents, representing 59% of the student population. MSU also saw significant increases in its four-, five- and six-year graduation rates, maintained a strong retention rate, and awarded a record number of degrees.

MSU's <u>research and scholarship expenditures</u> from state, private and federal funders for the past fiscal year totaled a record \$138.8 million. That marks a 9.5% increase over the previous year's expenditures and the sixth year in a row research expenditures have topped \$100 million.

MSU has succeeded in the <u>largest athletics fundraising campaign</u> in university history, raising \$18 million for the Bobcat Athletic Complex, an addition planned for the north end of Bobcat Stadium.

The National Institutes of Health awarded a five-year, \$10.7 million grant to MSU's <u>Center for American Indian and Rural</u> <u>Health Equity</u>, or CAIRHE, to continue its <u>mission to reduce health disparities in Native and rural communities</u>.

MSU's Department of Education has received \$6.2 million for a program to <u>recruit, train and mentor dozens of high-</u> <u>quality educators to work in rural areas of Montana</u>.

Montana's State Board of Nursing has allowed the College of Nursing to <u>extend the Accelerated Bachelor of Science in</u> <u>Nursing program to its Billings campus</u>, reaching more students in eastern Montana.

The National Environmental Health and Protection Accreditation Council recently accredited MSU's <u>environmental</u> <u>health program</u>, a designation that will make the program's graduates immediately employable and highly competitive in their field.

<u>Two new winter wheat varieties</u> designed to help address issues that plague wheat farmers across the state will be released this fall.

Earth sciences assistant professor Dave McWethy published a <u>paper</u> outlining best practices for resilience to wildfire, aiming to help community leaders living in a Western landscape where wildfires are inevitable.

MSU's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program has helped community members prepare their tax returns for years. But a new study shows that the program also <u>teaches student volunteers problem-solving skills</u>, commitment to their chosen profession and ethical decision-making.

MSU Extension and Stone Child College in Box Elder recently received a \$1.28 million grant <u>to provide mental health</u> <u>awareness</u> and technology instruction; after-school leadership group meetings; and outreach with local businesses and organizations.

MSU Culinary Services is supporting Montana producers by purchasing pigs, rabbits and goats from 57 4-H and FFA members. The meat is now being served in MSU's dining halls.
