A UM graduate student recently <u>attended the UN Climate Change Summit</u> in Madrid (COP25) as one of 12 student delegates representing the International Forestry Students Association.

A UM geosciences Professor Rebecca Bendick <u>was selected to lead UNAVCO</u>, a consortium that supports geophysics research and workforce development around the globe.
