Montana State University reported <u>strong fall enrollment of 16,249 students.</u> MSU's retention rate hit its highest mark in more than 30 years of modern record keeping at 78.2% percent. The fall figures showed that the four-year graduation rate was up to 34.7% from 29.7% last year.

Montana State University tallied an <u>all-time high for total research expenditures</u> in 2019-2020, totaling \$167 million.

Three MSU faculty members were selected to take part in the Montana University System's 2020 Teaching Scholars program, which seeks to help students succeed at Montana campuses. Paul Gannon, professor of chemical and biological engineering; Wan-Yuan Kuo, assistant professor of health and human development; and Meta Newhouse, professor of graphic design, were among the 14 scholars picked from across the university system.

Montana State University has been ranked one of the <u>best employers in Montana</u> in Forbes' 2020 annual "America's Best Employers by State" list.

Chaofu Lu, a professor in MSU's Department of Plant Sciences and Plant Pathology, will lead a team in administering an \$11 million grant from the Department of Energy to explore uses for the crop camelina. MSU will receive \$5.1 million of the total funding over five years.

MSU professor Vanessa Simonds and her collaborators received a grant worth nearly \$1 million to create a program for Apsáalooke youth to <u>spark interest in STEM fields and lead to cleaner water</u> for the Apsáalooke nation in southeast Montana.

MSU received a five-year grant worth at least \$1.3 million to continue the <u>TRIO Student Support Services</u> <u>program</u>, helping first-generation college students, low-income individuals and individuals with disabilities stay in school and graduate.

Cathy Cripps, a longtime Montana State University professor and researcher was recognized with a <u>national</u> teaching award for her work educating students on the wide world of wild fungi.

MSU students and area bankers had the opportunity to hear from national leaders in the banking industry during a <u>virtual roundtable</u> presented by the <u>MSU Jake Jabs College of Business and Entrepreneurship's Community Banking Program</u>.

A team of three students representing the recently reestablished student chapter of <u>American Indigenous</u> <u>Business Leaders</u>, or AIBL, at Montana State University recently took <u>first place in a business plan competition</u> at the organization's national conference.
