- The physical therapist assistant program reported a 100% pass rate for the national licensing exam in October, which is only achieved by 34 out of 255 PTA programs. The PTA program at FVCC is led by Janice Heil, PT, MAPT.
- More than 850 students were awarded over \$1 million in scholarships through the FVCC Foundation for the 2020-2021 academic year.
- The Broussard Family Library received a generous donation of over 280 rare books and original documents from the Chickering family of Whitefish, MT. The collection tells the story of the Rocky Mountain region and its captivating history through accounts of explorers, trappers, and others that helped shape the American west.

- Logger Sports student athlete, Isabel Kerst, received the Montana Athletes in Service Award from the Montana Campus Compact for her outstanding service and dedication to her community and her education.

- The nursing program partnered with Montana Technological University to provide nursing students a pathway from an ASN at FVCC to BSN at Montana Tech with a clear course plan, seamless transfer, and up to \$1000 scholarship money to help students succeed.
