Dr. Frances O'Reilly, after 19 years of dedicated service to The University of Montana, has merited the commendation of the Board of Regents of the Montana University System and has earned the title of Professor of Educational Leadership Emerita.

## **EXPLANATION**

Dr. O'Reilly received a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology and English from Carroll College. She holds Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Montana, and a Doctor of Education Degree in Educational Leadership from The University of Montana.

Dr. O'Reilly is dedicated, conscientious, diligent, and ever present for our students, faculty, staff, and the community. As professor, scholar, leader, and mentor in the Department of Educational Leadership, she has advised graduate students, chaired 15 successful doctoral dissertation committees, and through her leadership has raised the level of departmental esteem to new heights. Dr. O'Reilly has presented at the local, state, national and international level. She exhibits an excellent teaching record and has inspired students to challenge the status quo. She has published an impressive number of articles in the field of education.
