UMW Raises \$1M in New Support of Sports & Activities Complex

The Sports & Activities Complex project at the University of Montana Western recently achieved a major milestone due to recent fundraising gifts totaling \$1 million. These latest donations bring the total to \$3.2M funds raised, initiating the land transfer. The complex will be built on 14 acres of land adjacent to campus that John and Phyllis Erb pledged to the university in 2019. As part of the pledge, the Erbs included a fundraising challenge that provided the momentum to launch the fundraising efforts.

"The Erbs' pledge was the catalyst for this project," said Montana Western Chancellor, Michael Reid. "We are so grateful for their generosity and shared vision that creating a facility like this on campus would be transformative for both the university and our community."

The Erbs' vision is the establishment of a space that will benefit not only the students at Montana Western, but also the youth in Beaverhead County, in addition to the Montana Youth Challenge Academy cadets.

UMW and Montana Center for Horsemanship to Host Natural Horsemanship Conference

"The Natural Horsemanship Revolution" will be held at the Montana Center for Horsemanship and the University of Montana Western in Dillon, Montana, September 8-10, 2022. Focusing on a global understanding of Natural Horsemanship, this conference will feature a wide range of clinics, presentations, keynotes, award-winning films and leaders in the field with a goal of sharing knowledge to advance the horse-human relationship. The Equine Studies Department at the University of Montana Western offers the nation's only Bachelor of Science degree in Natural Horsemanship with options in management, psychology, science and instruction.

The MCH teaches the 'La Cense Method,' which was developed under William Kriegel, owner of Haras de la Cense in France and co-founder of MCH. The La Cense Method is a progressive, step-by-step process that blends the best of traditional horsemanship training with the art of training and riding horses—all in a manner that works with a horse's behavior, instincts, and personality. Taking a positive and respectful approach, the La Cense Method gradually builds trust, and frees the horses to be confident in all they are asked to perform.

• 30th Annual Bulldog Bash to be Held this Fall

The University of Montana Western Foundation, UMW Athletics Department, and the Bulldog Club will host the 30th Annual Bulldog Bash dinner and auction on September 24, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. in the Keltz Arena on the UMW campus.

The day's events start at 11:00 a.m. with a tailgate celebration at Vigilante Field followed by the Montana Western vs. Montana Tech football game. Doors open for the Bulldog Bash at the Keltz Arena after the football game with dinner being served at 5:30 p.m. A "Legacy of Casey Keltz" video tribute, silent auction, and live auction will take place during the Bash.

Institutions earned points based on exceptional student-athlete grade point averages and by having minimal to no ejections during competition throughout the course of the academic year.

He also completed a post-doctoral fellowship at Case Western University. Dr. Johnson started his duties at the University of Montana Western on July 11, 2022.

• 1970s WMC Alumni Scholarship Awarded to UMW Students

The University of Montana Western is pleased to announce that Joelnell Momberg and Darcy Walker have been awarded the 1970s Western Montana College (WMC) Alumni Scholarship for 2022-23.

To be awarded this scholarship, students must hold at least a 3.0 GPA and have a relative that attended the University of Montana Western. Each student will be awarded a \$500 scholarship for the 2022-23 academic year. The 1970s WMC Alumni Scholarship has been providing

students with financial support since 2019. After 3.5 years of fundraising and the generosity of the donors, the group has endowed their scholarship with a core membership of 38 donors.

Montana Western Hosts Shakespeare in the Park's 50th Season Performance and Theatre Camps for Children

A special commemorative plaque thanking the Community of Dillon for hosting the tour's performances was presented to Bethanie Wharton this summer on behalf of the UMW School of Outreach, a local sponsor of the Shakespeare in the Park event held each year in the Dillon community since 1986.
