MSU has joined with a dozen other universities in the region to form a <u>partnership aimed at creating economic</u> development opportunities around emerging high-tech industries.

As part of their senior capstone project, MSU engineering students <u>developed a portable filter to remove</u> <u>contaminants from water</u>.

Research shows that farmers and ranchers throughout Montana and the West experience, on average, a medium level of stress, which could impact sleep, physical health and mental health, according to Michelle Grocke, health and wellness specialist with MSU Extension and assistant professor in the Department of Health and Human Development.

MSU accounting students will once again gain valuable experience by <u>offering tax preparation help for students and community members</u> as part of the IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program.

Graduating senior Tyler Noyes received the <u>Outstanding Student Leadership award</u> from the MSU College of Agriculture for his commitment to service. He plans to pursue a career in agriculture education.

A student in MSU's Doctor of Nursing Practice program, Riesa Overstreet, won the university's <u>Big Idea</u>

<u>Challenge</u> last fall, advancing into the regional round of the <u>national program with a medical device of her own creation.</u>

Graduate student Riley Nielsen of the Jake Jabs College of Business and Entrepreneurship was awarded the <u>American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' Scholarship for Minority Accounting Students</u>, which aims to increase the diversity of the accounting profession.

MSU researchers are studying the potential for using <u>anaerobic digestion to process household food waste</u>. The resulting biogas could be captured and used for energy production and digestate, a nutrient-rich fertilizer.

A graduate student in MSU's <u>School of Film and Photography</u> has <u>partnered with NASA's Hubble Space</u>
<u>Telescope team</u> to create a documentary about the Hubble constant, a ratio scientists use to quantify the rate of the universe's expansion.

Matt Caires, Montana State University's dean of students, has been named to the <u>National Association for Behavioral Intervention and Threat Assessment</u> Advisory Board. He is the first person from the state of Montana to serve on the board.
