#### Canvas Early Learning Center Opens New Location at UMW

Canvas Early Learning Center (ELC) opened a new location on August 10, 2023, on the Montana Western campus that will expand licensed infant and childcare in Beaverhead County. Funded by Montana's Department of Public Health and Human Services through a Childcare Innovations Grant, project partners Canvas ELC, UMW, and the Early Childhood Coalition aim to increase childcare availability for families while supporting the local economy. The new location at UMW has the expanded classroom capacity for 34 children ages 2-5, with an infant and toddler classroom planned to open on UMW's campus in September 2024. The new location will also allow UMW Early Education students to enhance their skillsets through real-world teaching experiences at the Center. As a trusted mentor, Canvas will offer guidance and demonstrate best practices in working with young children, providing additional opportunities for UMW students to actively engage in their field of study.

## • UMW Holds Groundbreaking Ceremony for Sports & Activities Complex

The University of Montana Western hosted a Groundbreaking Ceremony on August 16, 2023, to kick-off construction of its highly anticipated Sports & Activities Complex with the goal to begin using the new facility in fall 2024. The event brought together community members, donors, students, and guests at the complex's construction site on the UMW football practice field and symbolized a significant step toward creating a modern facility for athletics, recreation, and community events.

## UMW Vice Chancellor Tricia Fiscus to Start new Role at Flathead Valley Community College

The University of Montana Western has announced that current Vice Chancellor of Administration and Finance, Tricia Fiscus, will be stepping down from her role at UMW to serve as Vice President/CFO at Flathead Valley Community College.

Before coming to Montana Western in 2021, Fiscus worked at Washington State University for 21 years, then at Klamath Community College (KCC) where she went on to become the Vice President of Administrative Services and CFO for KCC for two and a half years. She will begin her new role at FVCC in mid-September.

#### UMW Appoints Dr. Estee Aiken as Dean of Strategic Initiatives

The University of Montana Western is pleased to announce the hiring of Dr. Estee Aiken as the next Dean of Strategic Initiatives. Aiken earned a Bachelor of Arts in Music from Macalester College, in St. Paul, Minnesota in 2001, followed by a Master of Arts in Teaching Elementary School from Colorado College in 2002. She earned her Doctor of Education in Education Studies from the University of Northern Colorado in 2012.

Aiken currently serves as the Division Chair of Education at Montana Western, where she has also served as a professor since 2011 and has taught over 25 different education courses. She has also been actively involved at the state level in several roles including Montana Council of Deans of Education, Montana University System Teacher Scholar 2022-23, current campus lead for the Teacher Residency Demonstration Project, and President of the Montana Association of Colleges for Teacher Education. She will start the duties of her new position at Montana Western on August 28, 2023.

## • UMW Ranks in Top 200 Colleges for Indigenous Students

Montana Western has earned a place in the 2023-24 American Indian Science and Engineering Society's (AISES) "Top 200 Colleges for Indigenous Students." The list will be featured in the "Winds of Change" 30<sup>th</sup> annual Special College Issue to be published in November. The Special College Issue is a highly anticipated reference for high school students, teachers, and counselors and is the only resource of its kind for the growing number of Native Americans, Alaska Natives, and Native Hawaiians who are concentrating on STEM disciplines in higher education.

#### Montana Western Presents "David Korty: Work on Paper"

The University of Montana Western Fine Arts Gallery is proud to present "Work on Paper" by renowned artist David Korty. The gallery will host an opening reception on Friday, September 8, 2023 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. in the Fine Arts Gallery located in Main Hall.

In this new group of work, the artist has chosen his experience as an avid fly tyer and fisherman as a springboard from which to draw and paint, all from his own unique perspective. Korty was born in San Francisco in 1971 and has been living and working as an artist in Los Angeles since 1996. Korty's work has been shown extensively in Los Angeles, in solo exhibitions at Night Gallery, China Art Objects, Kohn Gallery and LAXART; at Derek Eller Gallery and Greene Naftali in New York; and at Sadie Coles HQ in London.

"I am excited to open the academic year with this stunning exhibition by artist David Korty. It is my hope that this exhibition resonates strongly with Southwest Montana," said Montana Western Fine Arts Gallery Coordinator and Adjunct Instructor, Jennifer Boysen.

Broughton worked with veterinarians to care for rescued elephants at the Elephant Nature Park and provided medical support at the Dog Rescue Clinic. A UMW biology graduate, Broughton was selected for the program based on her academic achievements.

"Going to Thailand has been a dream of mine for many years, so when I found out I got accepted into this program I was over the moon with excitement. I have always had a passion for travel and culture, as well as a love and passion for animals and this trip combined both in the most magical way imaginable," said Broughton.

"I am extremely excited to be the next head coach. This program has meant a lot to me over the last eight years and we have a great group dedicated to the sport, and I am so happy I get to be a part of helping them grow on and off the court," said Cooper.
