2025 Commencement - The Registrar's office reported that 250 students received a total of 321 degrees. The numbers break down in the following ways: 87 women, 163 men, 53 certificates, 129 associate's, 159 bachelor's and 10 master's degrees. This year's Commencement speaker was Chris Faber.

<u>Powwow</u> - The 48th Annual Sweetgrass Society Powwow drew an impressive crowd during its two-day celebration on April 11 and 12. The student-led, student-organized event featured over 100 dancers.
