INTRODUCTION

Decision Day is the fourth event in the academic year facilitated by programs within the Office of the Commissioner of Higher Education as part of the College Access Arc of Events. These events are designed to help students graduate with tools and skills for success in post-secondary education, career, and life. Collectively, the events are known as *APPLY*, *AID*, and *ACT*.



Decision Day celebrates students' plans for post-secondary education, military service, or career. For the students who have *applied* to college and secured financial *aid*, they still need to *act*.

Decision Day recognizes the act of signing college acceptance letters and committing to post-secondary pursuits.

Decision Day is a week in which schools celebrate all students who made it to graduation and are going to college, serving their country, starting a career, or embarking on other adventures.

SUGGESTED FLOW OF DECISION DAY EVENTS

The Friday before: Introduce Decision Day, review its purpose (i.e. to celebrate seniors and their plans, including college, career, military service), and invite your community to participate with schools across Montana (and the nation).

Monday: Mayoral Proclamation for the week, raise awareness through social media, begin highlighting seniors.

Tuesday: Continue with events and social media.

Wednesday: Decision Day main event(s).

Thursday: Continue with awareness and social media presence.

Friday: Wrap up the celebration with a school-wide message of congratulations.

SUGGESTED ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR THE WEEK

Friday before: "Starting next week we will be celebrating our senior class and highlighting their future plans. We are proud of our graduating class."

Monday: "This week, we are celebrating our senior class and what they will be doing after high school. Here are some opportunities you can join in as part of our celebration: [List of activities]"

Tuesday: "As we continue to celebrate our senior class and their post-graduation plans, we would like to mention the following students who are going to college: [Student Name; College Name"

Wednesday: "This week we are celebrating our senior class and what they will be doing after high school. Today, we recognize those who are going into the military: [Student Name; Military Branch]"

Thursday: "This week, we are celebrating our senior class and what they will be doing after high school. Today, we recognize those who are going to start a career, get on the job training, or pursue other opportunities: [Student Name; Plans]"

If you hope to go to college, please talk with your advisor to make sure you take the right classes and know how to afford it. Congratulations to our senior class!"

ADDITIONAL ANNUONCEMENTS FOR EVENTS

"As part of our celebration of our senior class, we would like to ask that tomorrow you wear clothing to represent your future plans. For example, if you are thinking about attending college, wear something that shows the college you want to attend."

"Our senior class is signing a banner to show their future plans. Seniors, please stop by and add your plans. The banner is located [identify where]. We hope you will take a minute to stop and check out the next step for our seniors. Congratulate them when you see them in the halls."



Asking for Support: You may have local businesses or philanthropists who support higher education. Be specific in your ask. Have a budget of all expenses. You also may reach out to the university or college where your students will be attending and ask for promotional items.

FAFSA

Many students who sign their acceptance letters or simply make the decision to attend college are still without a plan to pay for school. Decision Day events are ideal opportunities to remind students and families to complete the FAFSA. Your availability is at its highest until the end of the year, so now is the time to act...

As of April 5, 2024, just 26.4% of Montana seniors have completed the FAFSA, so accessing financial aid remains a critical issue for the state as we look to the 2024-25 school year. We understand that this year's FAFSA completion has been hindered by delays and issues, and your continued efforts are greatly appreciated. Please see the following resources as you work with students and families to complete FAFSA this year.


